About this document

Introduction

Established in 2018, the Vance Center's Keep Families Together (KFT) initiative connects pro bono lawyers abroad with legal service providers and immigration attorneys in the U.S. representing migrant individuals and families. Through this program, volunteer counsel assists in obtaining vital records, police and medical records, and other official documentation from migrants' countries of origin or transit to support the legal and administrative processes that lead to family reunification and long-term immigration relief.

Today, the KFT initiative collaborates with more than 150 law firms, pro bono clearinghouses, non-profit organizations, bar associations, and university legal clinics across five continents. Together, we have supported the legal representation of more than 500 individuals and families, contributing to numerous reunifications and durable forms of immigration relief.

As the immigration policy landscape in the U.S. continues to shift, legal service providers must adapt to address their clients' needs, and tools that can support overburdened and under-resourced service providers are more important than ever.

In 2025 alone, KFT received more than 186 requests for assistance. Looking ahead, we anticipate sustained demand for these services. As cases have increased, our team has noted that immigration attorneys frequently encounter some of the same questions and procedural barriers, many of them related to the essential vital records their clients need for their cases. These questions include: **how to obtain birth, marriage, and divorce certificates; how to secure death certificates; and how to access police records.**

The relevant information about how to access these documents is often fragmented, difficult to navigate, or not immediately accessible to practitioners, who have limited time to devote to these proceedings. This information gap has critical consequences – we know that delays or uncertainty in obtaining such documentation can materially affect the pace and outcome of immigration proceedings.

In response to this gap, the Vance Center has developed this practical reference tool covering an initial group of 31 jurisdictions for which we frequently receive requests. The guide includes countries in Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, and the Caribbean. The chapters for three countries (Brazil, India, and Mexico) include sub-sections with state-level information for a selection of states. This guide complements the Vance Center's previously published resource, [*Accessing Vital and Official Records in Latin America: A Guide for Immigration Practitioners*](#), published in March 2026. While that guide focused on 14 jurisdictions in Latin America and covered a broader range of procedures related to obtaining and correcting official records, this new version expands the geographic scope significantly and narrows the focus to the official documents most frequently requested in immigration matters.



The Guide covers:

- **Procedures to request and obtain birth, marriage, divorce, and death certificates**
- **Locating and obtaining criminal, police, or arrest records**

Each country chapter includes information about the appropriate authorities or agencies responsible for these records, the processes to request them, timing and associated costs, and other relevant information. When applicable, it also includes information about available digital or remote procedures that can enable practitioners to more efficiently assist migrant clients.

Access to these documents is often essential to ensure immigration processes can move forward. By providing more clarity around cross-border procedures, services, associated costs, and digital options, we hope this Guide will support immigration service providers to offer more timely, informed, and effective legal representation to their clients.

This Guide is based on information compiled in early 2026. This information is for general reference only and is not legal advice. Requirements, fees, and procedures may change over time and may vary within regions of each country. Whenever available, we have included references to official sources so that attorneys may verify and obtain the most up-to-date information directly. What is the government authority or agency responsible for issuing this document?	Birth certificates are issued by the Civil Registry in Colombia (the Registraduría Nacional del Estado Civil) at a national level. Copies of birth certificates can be issued also by Colombian consulates abroad.

What are the typical documents or information required to request this certificate?	<u>Requirements:</u> • Present an examination of the blood group and RH factor of the person whose birth is to be registered (when the antecedent document is different from the live birth certificate). • Present the person to be registered, proving their birth through the previous document. • The declarant must be duly identified and meet the requirements of the link with the person to be registered in accordance with the law. <u>Deadline for registration:</u> • The registration of the birth must be made within the month following the occurrence of the event, after which the registration will be understood to be untimely. <u>Background documents for registration:</u> • Certificate of live birth. • Authentic documents, such as citizenship cards, judgments. • Indigenous authorization (Only for members of these communities). • Ecclesiastical certificate and/or baptismal certificate, with certificate of competence of the minister who celebrated the act. • ICBF Resolution (in the case of minors in the administrative process of restoration of rights).

- Resolution of the National Civil Registry Directorate (In the case of foundlings or children of unknown parents).
- Foreign Civil Registry or certificate duly apostilled or legalized and translated (only in case the birth had occurred abroad).
- Forms issued by authorized midwives and midwives.
- In the absence of the above, registration may be made with the sworn statement of two witnesses to the fact of birth (they must be persons who have witnessed the event or have direct and reliable knowledge of it). The parents cannot be witnesses.

Divorce certificate

What is the government authority or agency responsible for issuing this document?	- Divorces and divorce certificates in Colombia are issued by notaries (uncontested divorces) or judges in the family court (contested divorces). - Divorces must be registered with the National Civil Registry.
Can the document be obtained online?	No. Only marriage certificates (with divorce annotations) can be obtained online.
Please provide the link.	Marriage certificates with divorce annotations can be obtained on the civil registry: https://copiaderegistrocivil.registraduria.gov.co/
Please provide a brief description of the process.	- Divorce certificates will only be issued at the family courthouse or notary office where the divorce was declared. - Therefore, to obtain the official copy, the courthouse/notary where the divorce was declared needs to be contacted. - The National Civil Registry does not issue divorce certificates but will update the marriage certificate with a divorce annotation (see above the description for how to obtain a marriage certificate).
