Gen Certificate: Clothing Manufacturing Process

TARGET AUDIENCE

Individuals considering a career in the clothing sector. The qualification provides the necessary skills for running a small business in clothing manufacturing, including an understanding of finance, managerial expertise, supply and demand, research market trends, and communication.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

While there is open access to the qualification, it is assumed that learners are already competent at Communication and Numeracy at ABET level 3 (equivalent to Standard 5 or Grade 7).

This qualification may be achieved in part or in whole through the recognition of prior learning, therefore, learners who have achieved English and Mathematics at Grade 9 level will be exempted from the fundamental learning modules.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This qualification applies to people within the clothing sector and prepares learners for employment and further education or training. The qualification will introduce the skills, knowledge, and understanding needed by those considering a career in the clothing sector. The learner will obtain a nationally recognised qualification in clothing manufacturing processes.

- Demonstrate an understanding of entrepreneurship and develop entrepreneurial qualities.

- Demonstrate an understanding of managerial expertise and administrative capabilities.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the principles of supply and demand, and the concept production.

- Demonstrate an understanding of fundamental Mathematical Literacy as it pertains to a range of computational skills.
