A	DISPOSE OF BIOMEDICAL WASTE IN ACCORDANCE WITH STANDARDS. -- Dispose of contaminated sharps, in accordance with applicable laws, standards, and policies. -- Dispose of blood or other biohazard fluids or tissue, in accordance with applicable laws, standards, or policies.	100

B	CLEAN MEDICAL EQUIPMENT AND PREPARE MEDICAL INSTRUMENTS OR EQUIPMENT FOR USE. -- Organize or clean blood-drawing trays, ensuring that all instruments are sterile and all needles, syringes, or related items are of first-time use.	100

E	CONDUCT DIAGNOSTIC TESTS TO DETERMINE PATIENT HEALTH -- Conduct standards tests, such as blood alcohol, blood culture, oral glucose tolerance, glucose screening, blood smears, or peak and trough drug levels tests. -- Conduct hemoglobin tests to ensure donor iron levels are normal. -- Monitor blood or plasma donors during and after procedures to ensure health, safety, and comfort.	200
