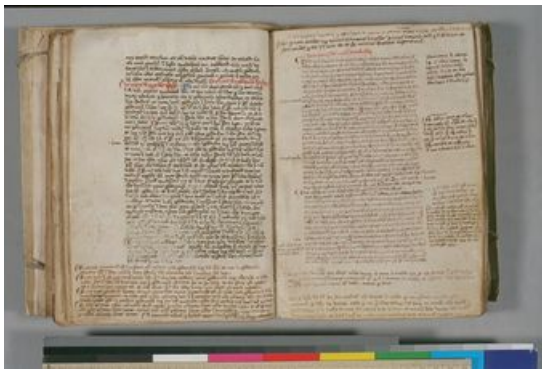

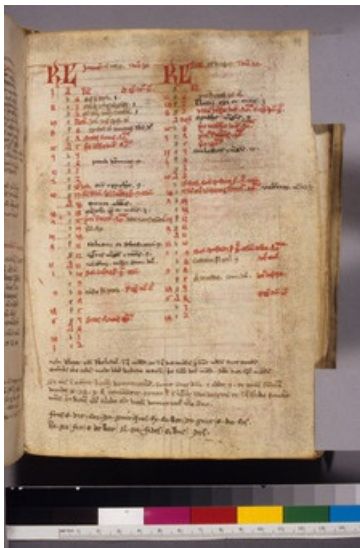

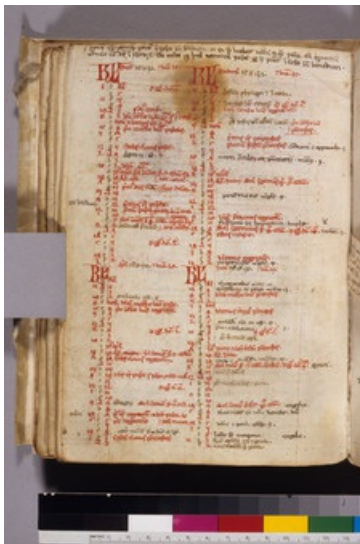

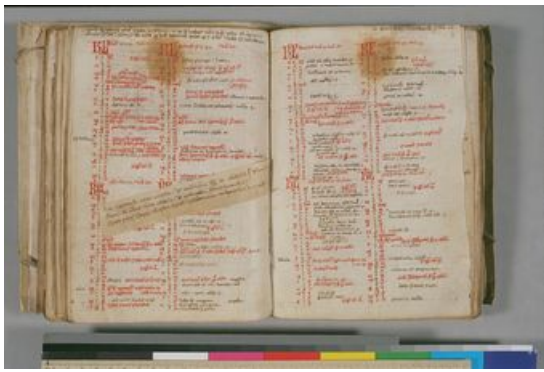

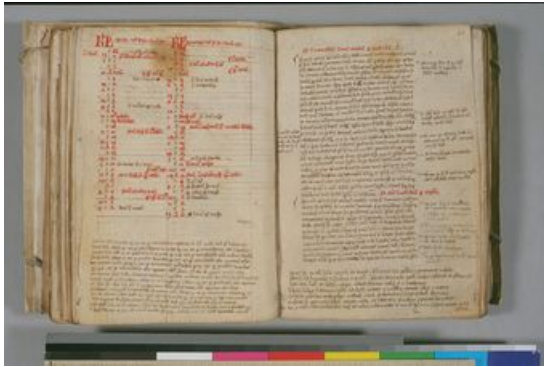

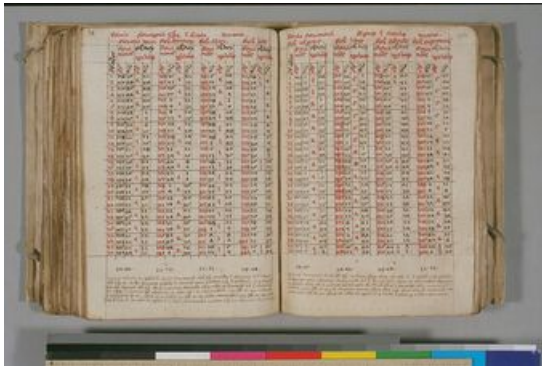

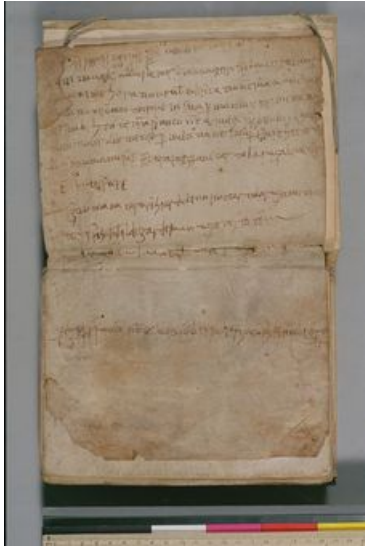
Title: Conveyance

Language(s): Latin

Incipit: Conveyance of lands near "Carisco" and Ilci to Dominicus, abbot of the monastery of S. Leucio in Todi.

Notes: Blank on the dorse except for later note with the place names, "de cariscu et ilcisca." Evidently the lower portion of London, British Library, Add. 38795 A, regarding the sale of these same lands to abbot Dominicus of the same monastery. One other piece of the document remains undiscovered.

Status of text: Fragment (lower portion of the deed with the signs of the witnesses).
