Report on young peoples' free-time activities

Summary:

15 girls and 15 boys, aged 11–16, were asked what they did in their free time.

Analysis:

In general, with the exception of jogging, boys took part in more sports than girls. Only 7 boys went jogging while close to double that number, 12, was represented by the girls.

While 5 out of the 20 girls went swimming, boys were almost double that number (9). None of the girls played golf, yet 2 boys did. This was by far the least popular sport of the 5 sports. By contrast, the most popular sport is tennis. An interesting statistic is that an equal number of girls and boys played tennis each week, representing 13 of each sex. This figure also indicates that just 2 of the boys and 2 of the girls did not participate in this sport. Finally, twice as many boys went cycling than girls (10 and 5, respectively).
