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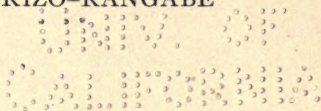

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PREFACE.



THE Greek language has existed, without very serious alteration, nearly three thousand years. In its present form it differs less from that of Xenophon than the language of Xenophon differs from that of Homer.

If my intention had been to limit myself to the language now used by the educated classes in Greece in literature, in the daily press, in the pulpit, and elsewhere, I should have had little else to do than to copy the rules of ancient Greek grammar with some additions and modifications. Some forms of the ancient language, such as the dual number, the pluperfect, the optative, etc., have become obsolete, and the general spirit of the modern idiom is more analytical than the classical form; the latter, however, is still considered as a general treasury from which everybody may borrow, and a model to be constantly imitated as closely as possible by all men of letters.

But this more perfect language is not sufficient for foreigners travelling in Greece and coming in contact with the people, whose language is strongly influenced by local idioms, as it was even in ancient times. In the following lessons, therefore, I have been careful to indicate, by the

abbreviation vlg. (vulgar), placed after the correct forms used by educated people the forms of the popular language which it is necessary to know, although one should avoid using them, at least in writing.

The pronunciation of the Modern Greek language is certainly not that of the ancient; but that used in the schools of Europe and America is also open to grave objection. It would at least be of great practical advantage if the one now used in Greece were universally adopted, as its adoption would greatly facilitate to scholars the learning of the modern language, which is so widely used in the East.

This *Method* is divided into thirty lessons, each containing rules of grammar, examples illustrating these rules, and exercises. The verb is introduced in the second lesson, and its forms are then developed alternately with those of the other parts of speech. All the principles of Greek grammar are thus presented, care being taken to distinguish everywhere the forms of the literary or polite language from those of the vulgar idiom. The lessons are followed by reading-matter which has been so selected as to represent the language now used in Greece by all educated people both in speaking and in writing. The use of more classical forms and constructions in speaking would appear to a modern Greek pretentious and affected, while the introduction of words and forms of the vulgar idiom, although tolerated in familiar conversation, would certainly be considered a mark of gross ignorance in writing or in polite speech.

The vocabularies which complete the book contain almost all the Greek words that a beginner is likely to require in Greece. The English-Greek vocabulary will thus take the place of a handy dictionary of the Modern Greek language; in it the English-speaking student will be able to find any Greek word that he may require, either in preparing the exercises of this *Method*, or for general use. The Greek-English vocabularies have been arranged according to the sequence of grammatical rules and parts of speech, each special vocabulary giving all the most common examples; every Greek word that occurs in the lessons will also be found in its respective vocabulary with the English meaning. Each of these vocabularies should be committed to memory at the time when the lesson to which it belongs is prepared.

I am greatly indebted to Professor John Williams White, of Harvard University, for most valuable suggestions and assistance rendered in the preparation of this book.

Φωνήεντα. — Vowels.

2. There are seven vowels in the Greek alphabet. They are pronounced as follows : —

a : like *a* in *father*; e.g. πατήρ, *father*, pron. pateér; γάλα, *milk*, pron. ghála.

ε : like *e* in *well*; e.g. θέλω, *I wish*, pron. théllo; ἐδώ, *here*, pron. ethó.

η { all three like *ee* in *eel*; e.g. φήμη, *fame*, pron. feéme;
ι { ὄχι, *no*, pron. óhee; ὕδωρ, *water*, pron. eéthor. When
υ { *ι* is subscript it is not pronounced; e.g. ἀγαπᾷ, *he loves*,
 pron. aghapá.

ο { both like *o* in *on*; e.g. ὄνος, *ass*, pron. ónnoss; γνώμη,
ω { *opinion*, pron. ghnómme.

Σύμφωνα. — Consonants.

3. The consonants are pronounced as follows : —

β = *v*; e.g. βεβαίως, *certainly*, pron. vevéoss.

γ : before *a* and *ο* sounds and before all consonants, something between *g* and *h* (*gh*), or like *g* in the German words *tragen*, *Wagner*; e.g. γράφω, *I write*, pron. ghráfo; γάλα, *milk*, pron. ghála. Before *ε* and *ι* sounds, like *y* in *yes*; e.g. γῆ, *earth*, pron. yee; γέρον, *old man*, pron. yéron. The combinations γγ and γκ, like *ng* in *England*; e.g. ἀγγλία, pron. angleéa; ὄγκος, *mass*, pron. óngoss. In γχ the *γ* has the sound of *ng* (nasal) in *sing*; e.g. ἔγχελυς, *eel*, pron. éng-helleess.

δ = *th* in *though*; e.g. δίδω, *I give*, pron. theétho. In the vulgar idiom after *ν* it has the sound of *d*; e.g. δένδρον, *tree*, pron. théndron.

ζ = *z*; e.g. ζῆλος, *zeal*, pron. zeéloss.

$\theta = th$ in *think*; e.g. *θάλασσα*, *sea*, pron. *thálassa*.

$\kappa = k$; e.g. *κῆπος*, *garden*, pron. *keéposs*. The combination $\gamma\kappa$, like *ng* in *England*; e.g. *συγκαλῶ*, *I convoke*, pron. *seengaló*.

$\lambda = l$; e.g. *λύκος*, *wolf*, pron. *leékoss*.

$\mu = m$; e.g. *μήτηρ*, *mother*, pron. *meéteer*.

$\nu = n$; e.g. *νύξ*, *night*, pron. *neex*. In the vulgar idiom, if the following word begins with π , ν has the sound of *m*; e.g. *τὸν πατέρα*, *the father* (acc.), pron. *tom batéra*.

$\xi = x$ in *excuse*; e.g. *ξηρός*, *dry*, pron. *xeeróss*.

$\pi = p$; e.g. *πῦρ*, *fire*, pron. *peer*. After μ , like *b*; e.g. *ἐμπρός*, *forward*, pron. *embróss*.

$\rho = r$; e.g. *ρίπτω*, *I throw*, pron. *reépto*.

$\sigma = s$; e.g. *σῶμα*, *body*, pron. *sómma*. Before β , δ , γ , μ , and ρ , like *z*; e.g. *σβύνω*, *I extinguish*, pron. *zveéno*.

$\tau = t$; e.g. *τρίτος*, *third*, pron. *treétoss*. After ν , like *d*; e.g. *ἐντός*, *within*, pron. *endóss*.

$\phi = f$; e.g. *φόβος*, *fear*, pron. *fóvoss*.

χ : before *a* and *o* sounds and all consonants a little thicker than *h* in *heart*, or like the German *ch* in *doch*; e.g. *χαρά*, *joy*, pron. *hará* (*khará*); *χώρα*, *country*, pron. *hóra* (*khóra*). Before *e* and *i* sounds, like *h* in *he*; e.g. *χείρ*, *hand*, pron. *heer*.

$\psi = ps$; e.g. *ψυχή*, *soul*, pron. *pseeheé*.

Δίφθογγοι. — Diphthongs.

4. There are eight diphthongs, pronounced as follows:—

$αι = e$ in *well*; e.g. *αἷμα*, *blood*, pron. *éma*.

before all vowels and the consonants β , γ , δ , ξ , λ , μ , ν , ρ respectively, like *av*, *ev*, *eev*; e.g. αὐλή, *court*, pron. avleé; εὐδαίμων, *happy*, pron. evthémon; ἡῦρον, *I found*, pron. eévron. Before the consonants θ , κ , ξ , π , σ , τ , ϕ , χ , ψ , like *af*, *ef*, *cef*; e.g. αὐτός, *he himself*, pron. aftóss; εὐθὺς, *direct*, pron. eftheéss; ἡῦξησα, *I increased*, pron. eéfxeessa.

ou = *ou* in *group*; e.g. οὐδεὶς, *nobody*, pron. outheés.

NOTE.—The sign (˘) placed above the second vowel of a diphthong is used to show that the two vowels must be pronounced separately; e.g. Μάιος, *May*, pron. máeeoss.

5. REMARK.—The vulgar idiom forms another diphthong by fusing the *ι* (or any of the diphthongs *ει*, *οι*, *υι*, having the sound of *ι*) with the following vowels. The *ι* is in this case pronounced like *y* in *yes*. This fusion is often shown by the sign (˘) placed under the vowels; e.g. ψωμιού, *of bread*, pron. psomyóu; ποιός, *who*, pron. pyoss; υἱός, *son*, pron. yoss.

Quantity of Vowels and Diphthongs.

6. The vowels η and ω are long; the vowels ϵ and $\omicron$ are short; the vowels α , ι , υ are sometimes long and sometimes short.

7. All diphthongs are long; but *αι* and *οι* are short when they are at the end of a word, with a few unimportant exceptions.

8. These distinctions of quantity make no difference whatever in the pronunciation of these vowels and diphthongs; but it is necessary to know them, as they affect the accentuation of the words.

Breathings.

9. All Greek words beginning with a vowel must have a *breathing* placed above this vowel. If the word begins with a diphthong, the breathing is placed above the second vowel.

10. There are two breathings, the rough (´) and the smooth (˘).

11. The majority of Greek words take the smooth breathing.

12. The vowel *v* at the beginning of a word always takes the rough breathing.

13. Of the consonants only *ρ* at the beginning of a word takes the rough breathing. When two *ρρ* meet in the middle of a word, the first takes the smooth and the second the rough breathing; *e.g.* θάρρος, *courage*, pron. thárross.

14. One learns the words that receive the rough breathing only by long practice. It may be of help to remember that English words derived from the Greek always begin with *h* when the corresponding Greek word has the rough breathing; *e.g.* *hypnotize* from ὕπνος; *harmony* from ἁρμονία; *hero* from ἥρως, *etc.*

15. The breathings do not in any way influence the pronunciation, except that if the rough is immediately preceded by one of the letters *κ, π, τ*, either in the composition of words or at the end of the preceding word, then these letters are respectively changed into *χ, φ, θ*; *e.g.* καχεξία for κακ' ἐξία; ἐφ' ἡμῖν for ἐπ' ἡμῖν; καθ' ἡμᾶς for κατ' ἡμᾶς.

Accents.

16. There are three accents in Greek, the acute (´), the grave (`), and the circumflex (^).

17. The accent can stand only on one of the last three syllables of a word. The syllable on which the accent is placed is pronounced with greater stress than the rest; *e.g.* πότε, *when*, pron. póte; ποτέ, *never*, pron. poté.

18. The grave accent is written in place of the acute on the last syllable of a word, unless the word terminates a sentence.

19. The circumflex can be placed only on one of the last two syllables, either on a long final syllable (*e.g.* τῆς τιμῆς, *of honor*, pron. teess teemeéss), or on a long penultimate if the final syllable is short (*e.g.* σφαῖρα, *ball*, pron. ssféra; εἶχον, *I had*, pron. eéhon). Rule to be committed to memory: *Long before final short, circumflex.*

20. The acute can be placed on any one of the last three syllables. Short vowels, when accented, always take the acute. A long penultimate, if accented, takes the acute when it is followed by a long final syllable; *e.g.* εἰρήνη, *peace*, pron. eereénee. Rule to be committed to memory: *Long before final long, acute.*

21. When the last syllable is long, the accent cannot be on the third syllable, but has to descend to the penultimate (*e.g.* the genitive of ἄνθρωπος, *man*, is ἀνθρώπου, because the termination is long). This rule is not always adhered to in the vulgar idiom; *e.g.* εὐκόλη, *easy*, pron. éfkolee; ἄσχημη, *ugly*, pron. ássheemee.

22. As a rule all the terminations of verbs and of the genitives of nouns, which are long and accented on the last syllable, take the circumflex; *e.g.* λαλῶ, *I speak*, pron. laló; λαλεῖς, *thou speakest*; τιμῆς, *of honor*; κακοῦ ἀδελφοῦ, *of a bad brother*.

Punctuation.

23. The period, the comma, and the note of exclamation are the same as in English. The semicolon is a period at the top of the line (·), and the mark of interrogation is like the English semicolon (;). The apostrophe (') is written over the place of an elided vowel; *e.g.* ἀλλ' ἐγώ, *but I*, pron. aleghó, for ἀλλὰ ἐγώ, alá eghó.

(The following should be read as if it were English. We have doubled the consonants after *e* and *a* wherever it was necessary to show that these vowels should be pronounced short.)

26. The definite article ὁ, *the*, is thus declined:—

27. NOTE. — The datives singular τῷ, τῇ, τῷ, and plural τοῖς, ταῖς, are not in common use. Instead of the dative it is customary to use the accusative with the preposition εἰς, *to*; thus, εἰς τόν, εἰς τούς, *etc.* (and in the vulgar idiom 'σ τόν, 'σ τούς) = *to the*.

28. REMARKS. — *a.* The article has no vocative.

b. The genitive plural is always τῶν.

c. The accusative of the neuter, both singular and plural, is always like the nominative.

Position.

29. The article is generally placed before the noun; *e.g.* ὁ λαός, *the people*; ἡ τιμή, *honor*. It is placed after the noun if this is followed by an adjective; *e.g.* Γεώργιος ὁ τρίτος, *George III.* In the vulgar idiom the article is in this case repeated, ὁ Γεώργιος ὁ τρίτος.

30. No article is used when geographical names are preceded by prepositions indicating motion from, to, or through a place; *e.g.* ἐκ Παρισίων εἰς Ἀθήνας, *from Paris to Athens*.

31. When an adjective precedes the noun, the article comes first; if the adjective follows the noun, the article is repeated; *e.g.* ὁ καλὸς ἄνθρωπος, ὁ ἄνθρωπος ὁ καλός, *the good man*.

32. When a demonstrative pronoun or the adjective ὅλος (πάς), *all*, precedes the noun, the article is placed between the two; *e.g.* οὗτος ὁ ἄνθρωπος, *this man*; ὅλος ὁ κόσμος, *all the world*.

33. All the words which qualify a noun can be placed, in the literary language, between the article and the noun; *e.g.* ὁ πάντων θνητῶν ἄριστος for ὁ ἄριστος πάντων θνητῶν, *the best of all mortals*.

34. The article is often used alone when its substantive can be easily supplied or has already been mentioned; *e.g.* ἡ καλλονὴ τῆς φύσεως καὶ ἡ τῆς γυναικός, *the beauty of nature and that of woman*.

35. There is no indefinite article in Greek, but the numeral εἷς, μία, ἓν (vlg. ἕνας, μία, ἓνα), *one*, is used in the vulgar idiom in this sense; *e.g.* μία γυνὴ ἔλεγε, *a woman was saying*, instead of the literary expression γυνὴ τις ἔλεγε.

37. NOTE 1. — The second person singular, ἔχεις, is always used in addressing intimate friends and inferiors.

38. NOTE 2. — The form ἔχουν for the third person plural is the one generally used in conversation, but the literary form ἔχουσι is alone used in writing.

39. REMARK 1. — Έχω, as all active verbs, always takes its object in the accusative.

40. REMARK 2. — The interrogative form is the same, being only distinguished by the inflexion of the voice, and in writing by the sign ;

43. REMARK. — The neuter ending ι, so common in Modern Greek, is derived from the ancient diminutive termination ιον (second declension), of which the two final letters are generally left out in the nom. and acc. singular, while in the gen. singular and in the plural the ι is pronounced like the English *y* in *yes*, and almost forms a diphthong with the final vowels (see § 5). The genitive of these nouns, both singular and plural, is always accented on the last syllable, and takes a circumflex. The accusative is always like the nominative; there is no dative.

44. They are declined as follows : —

54. Adjectives have three genders, masculine, feminine, and neuter, according to the gender of the substantive which they qualify.

Position.

55. When masculine or neuter adjectives are not accompanied by a substantive, ἄνθρωπος, *man*, must be understood in the first case, and πρᾶγμα, *thing*, in the second; e.g. οἱ καλοὶ καὶ οἱ κακοί, *the good and the bad (men)*; τὸ καλλίτερον εἶναι . . . , *the best (thing) is.*

The classic second aorist ἔσχον is sometimes used in the literary language.

FIRST DECLENSION.

69. In Modern Greek there are six declensions of nouns.

70. The *first declension* contains feminine nouns ending in *η* and *α*, and masculine nouns ending in *ης* and *ας*.

71. The feminine nouns ending in *η* are declined as follows:—

73. REMARK. — The genitive plural of all the nouns, masculine and feminine, of the first declension always has the accent on the last syllable, *e.g.* *τιμῶν, σεληνῶν, τροφῶν, etc.* This rule does not apply to adjectives, as we shall see later on.

ἦσαν (vlg. ἦταν), *they were*.

78. Like ἔχω, the auxiliary verb εἶμαι has only one past tense, ἦμην.

79. Feminine nouns of the *first declension* ending in *a* may be subdivided into two categories: first, those that have a vowel or the consonant *ρ* before the final *a*; second, those that have any other consonant than *ρ* before the final *a*.

82. REMARK 1.—*a.* It is important to note that the termination *as* of the *genitive singular* of these nouns is always long, and, when the accent falls upon it, this accent is always a circumflex (˘); *e.g.* τῆς χαρᾶς, τῆς ἀγορᾶς.

83. *b.* If the accent falls on the penultimate syllable, then it must always be an acute (´); *e.g.* τῆς ὥρας, τῆς ἡμέρας, τῆς σοφίας.

84. *c.* If in the nominative the accent falls on the antepenultimate, then in the genitive it will descend to the penultimate and be an acute, as in the above case (*b*); *e.g.* ἡ γέφυρα, *gen.* τῆς γεφύρας.

85. REMARK 2.—The *genitive plural* of all nouns of the first declension, as already mentioned in § 73, always has the accent on the last syllable, and this accent is always a circumflex; *e.g.* τῶν χαρῶν, τῶν ἀγορῶν, τῶν καρδιῶν, τῶν γεφυρῶν. This rule does not apply to adjectives, as we shall see in the following Remark (§ 89).

86. ἡ ἡμέρα τῆς ἐλευθερίας, *the day of liberty.*

The vulgar idiom does not make this distinction and always forms the genitive in ας (τῆς γλώσας, instead of τῆς γλώσσης), but this is never done by the educated classes, except in the case of a few modern nouns, generally derived from the Italian, which do not change the final α. 107. *b.* The genitive plural has a circumflex on the last syllable, as in the entire first declension.

110. There are two futures in Greek, the first and the second.

111. The *first future* expresses the action in its duration, that is, as *going on* or *repeated* in future time; e.g. ὅταν ἐπιστρέψῃς, θὰ τρώγω, *when you return I shall be eating*; θ' ἀγοράζω πάντοτε ἄρτον ἀπ' αὐτόν, *I shall always buy bread from him*.

112. The first future is conjugated thus:—

θὰ ἀγοράζω (θ' ἀγοράζω), *I shall buy* (habitually).

θὰ ἀγοράζῃς.

θὰ ἀγοράζῃ.

θὰ ἀγοράζωμεν.

θὰ ἀγοράζητε (vlg. ἀγοράζετε).

θὰ ἀγοράζωσι (vlg. ἀγοράζουν).

113. The first future is formed with *θά* and the present subjunctive (see § 212). *Θά* is a contraction of *θέλω ἵνα*, *I wish that*.

114. θὰ ἔχω, *I shall have*.

θὰ ἔχωμεν.

θὰ ἔχῃς.

θὰ ἔχητε (vlg. ἔχετε).

θὰ ἔχῃ.

θὰ ἔχωσι (vlg. ἔχουν).

115. θὰ εἶμαι, *I shall be*.

θὰ εἶμεθα.

θὰ εἴσῃ.

θὰ εἴσθε.

θὰ εἶναι.

θὰ εἶναι.

116. *θὰ λέγω, I shall say.*
θὰ τρώγω, I shall eat.
θὰ ἀκούω (θ' ἀκούω), I shall hear.

117. The *second future* expresses simply the future occurrence of the action, e.g. *ὅταν ἐπιστρέψῃς, θὰ φάγω, when you return, I shall eat; αὔριον θ' ἀγοράσω ἄρτον, to-morrow I shall buy bread.* It is conjugated in the same manner as the first future. It is formed with *θά* and the aorist subjunctive (see § 212).

118. *θὰ ἀγοράσω, I shall buy (simply). θὰ εἶπω, I shall say.*
θὰ ἀκούσω, I shall hear. θὰ φάγω, I shall eat.

119. The second future of some verbs, like the aorist, is formed on a different stem from that of the present, as *λέγω, τρώγω, etc.* (see above). **ἔχω* and *εἶμαι* have only the first future.

In the vulgar idiom the genitive or the accusative is used, *e.g.* σοῦ λέγω or σέ λέγω, *I tell you*. These pronouns always precede the verb, except ἡμῖν and ὑμῖν, which are placed after it.

164. The *stem* of a verb is its fundamental part, from which, by means of the terminations, the various moods and tenses are formed.

165. The aorist indicative is formed from the verb-stem by prefixing the augment (lengthening of the initial vowel, or prefixing the letter *ε* if the verb begins with a consonant), and in most verbs adding the terminations of the aorist; these are *σα, σας* (vlg. *σες*), *σε, σαμεν, σατε, σαν*.

166. Pres. ἀκούω, *I hear (am hearing)*.

Aor. ἤκουσα, *I heard (did hear)*. ἤκούσαμεν.

ἤκουσας. ἤκούσατε.

ἤκουσε. ἤκουσαν.

167. If the last letter, or characteristic, of the verb-stem is a mute, it either unites with the *σ* of the termination to form a double consonant (*ξ* or *ψ*), or it is rejected, as will be seen in the following lessons.

169. In a similar way, the aorist of ἀγοράζω, *I buy*, is ἡγόρασα; of νομίζω, *I think*, is ἐνόμισα; of ἀνοίγω, *I open*, is ἤνοιξα; of ἀρέσκω, *I please*, is ἤρεσα; of θέλω, *I wish*, is ἠθέλησα.¹

170. This is called the first aorist, and most verbs have no other. The few verbs that have a second aorist have generally no first aorist. The second aorist is distinguished from the first in that the terminations in the indicative are those of the imperfect, and in that the stem is generally different from or simpler than that of the present.

¹ The present was originally ἐθέλω, and this form still appears in the imperfect and aorist indicative, the ε being lengthened by the augment into η. The aorist of θέλω is altogether irregular, being formed on the stem ἐθελε.

181. REMARK. — In these compound tenses ἔχω and εἶχον are alone conjugated, as given in §§ 36, 67 and 114, while καθάρισει remains unchanged. καθάρισει represents the classical aorist infinitive καθάρισαι.

182. NOTE. — The seven tenses given above complete the indicative mood.

186. These particles in Modern Greek take either the indicative or the subjunctive. If the reference is to past time, or to present time in an unrealized supposition (e.g., ἂν ἦμην πλούσιος, θὰ ἐβοήθουν τοὺς πτωχοὺς, *if I were rich, I would help the poor*), or to future time when the supposition is joined with the conditional mood (see §§ 214–216), they take the past tenses of the indicative; in all other cases they take either the subjunctive or the future indicative.

The diminutive signification was lost in most of these nouns, and they were considered merely as another preferable form of the original nouns. 213. The subjunctive present of εἶμαι, *I am*, is written generally ἦμαι, ἦσαι, ἦναι, ἦμεθα, ἦσθε, ἦναι; but a great many scholars do not approve of this, and prefer to write εἶμαι, εἶσαι, etc., as in the indicative, when they do not use the classical subjunctive ὦ, ᾗς, ᾗ, ὦμεν, ᾗτε, ὦσι.

ἂν ἐνόμιζον ὅτι ἔχετε δίκαιον, θα σᾶς τὸ ἔλεγον, *if I thought that you were right, I should tell it to you.*

SECOND DECLENSION (*continued*).

217. Masculine and neuter adjectives of the second declension also end in *ος* and *ον*, like the corresponding substantives, and are declined like them.

218. The feminine of these adjectives is declined sometimes after the first declension and sometimes after the second. Those that follow the first end in *α* if the termination is preceded by a vowel or the consonant *ρ*, and in *η* if by any other consonant.

219. The following are examples of adjectives whose feminine ends in *α* : —

ἀριστερός, <i>left.</i>	μικρός, <i>small.</i>
ἀρχαῖος, <i>ancient, old.</i>	μωρός, <i>foolish.</i>
βέβαιος, <i>certain.</i>	ξηρός, <i>dry.</i>

δεξιός, <i>right.</i>	πλούσιος, <i>rich.</i>
δροσερός, <i>fresh.</i>	πτωχός, <i>poor.</i>

καθαρός, <i>clean.</i>	φοβερός, <i>terrible.</i>
κρύος, <i>cold.</i>	ψυχρός, <i>cold.</i>

220. Ἄσπρος, *white*, μαῦρος, *black*, χονδρός, *thick*, and a few others belonging to the vulgar idiom, do not follow the above rule, and have the feminine in *η*.

221. σὰς ἀρέσκει τὸ ἄσπρο (see p. 25, note 1) κρασί; *do you like white wine?*

μοὶ ἀρέσκει τὸ μαῦρο, *I like black.*

ἡ ἀρχαία μας φιλία, *our old friendship.*

ὁ κύριος οὗτος εἶναι πλούσιος, *this gentleman is rich.*

ὁ παλαιὸς οἶνος εἶναι καλός, *old wine is good.*

αὕτῃ ἡ πέτρα δὲν εἶναι ἄσπρη, εἶναι μαύρη, *this stone is not white; it is black.*

223. Do you wish to see if the room is clean? No, I saw that it was clean.—Do the boys hope to get rich

gifts? No, they are not foolish; they only hope to get black and dry bread and cold water. — Had you written to him (τῷ or τὸν at the beginning of the phrase) to clean the old house and to prepare the small room? I had not written to him then (τότε), but I wrote to him two days before yesterday. — Do you find the sea beautiful? No, the sea is terrible to-day; I do not like it. — As soon as you have eaten you shall write to the teacher. — Before you put the oil in the lamp, you shall clean it. — If your brother thinks that the boy has written this (αὐτὸ τὸ) beautiful book, he is wrong. — If he thought it (imperfect, *was thinking it*), he would have told me (θὰ μοι τὸ εἶλεγε). — We shall see if you are right.

LESSON XIV.

VERBS (*continued*).

π-MUTE VERBS.

224. θ' ἀκούσης τὴν συμβουλὴν μου; *will you hear (listen to) my advice?*

θὰ ὑπογράψης τὴν ἐπιστολὴν σου; *will you sign your letter?*

πότε θὰ ἐπιστρέψης; *when will you return?*

225. The first aorist is formed, as we said in § 165, by adding the termination *σα* to the verb-stem and prefixing the augment. This presents no difficulty when the last letter (or characteristic) of the verb-stem is a vowel, as in the case of ἀκούω, *I hear*; ἤκουσα, *I heard*.

226. But when the last letter of the stem is a consonant, it either unites with the *σ* to form a double consonant (*ξ* or *ψ*), or else it is rejected.

227. We will take in this lesson the three labial consonants π, β, φ (called also π-mutes), which in conjunction with *σ* make the double consonant ψ.

228. The following are the most commonly used verbs of this kind:—

229. The impersonal verb *πρέπει*, *it must be, it is necessary*, has no aorist, but only the forms *πρέπει*, present, *ἔπρεπε*, imperfect, and *θὰ πρέπει*, future.

230. REMARK. — Verbs compounded with prepositions take the augment *between* the preposition and the verb, the prepositions dropping their final vowel before the augment *ε*; *e.g.* ἐπιτρέπω (*ἐπι-τρέπω*), imp. ἐπέτρεπον; ὑπογράφω (*ὑπο-γράφω*), ὑπέγραφον. The prepositions *περί* and *πρό* are not elided before the augment *ε*; *e.g.* προβλέπω (*προ-βλέπω*), προέβλεπον (irregular aorist προεἶδον).

231. In the vulgar idiom the augment precedes the preposition if this begins with a consonant; *e.g.* συμβουλεύω, *advise*, ἐσυμβούλευσα; διατάσσω, *command*, ἐδιάταξα; περιγράφω, *describe*, ἐπερίγραψα; προβλέπω, *foresee*, ἐπρόβλεψα; προσέχω, *pay attention*, ἐπρόσεξα; καταλαμβάνω, *understand*, ἐκατάλαβα. If the preposition begins with a vowel, the past tenses do not augment at all; *e.g.* ἐπιτρέπω, *allow*, ἐπίτρεψα; ἀνακατόνω, *mix*, ἀνακάτωσα; ἐκλέγω, *choose*, ἔκλεξα; ἐντρέπομαι, *am ashamed*, ἐντράπην (*ἐντράπηκα*).

232. ἐπέστρεψεν ὁ ἀδελφός σου; *has your brother returned?*
 θὰ ἐπιστρέψῃ αὔριον, *he will return to-morrow.*
 ἔπεμψας τὴν ἐπιστολὴν μου; *did you send my letter?*
 δὲν τὴν ἔπεμψα διότι δὲν τὴν εἶχατε ὑπογράψει, *I did not send it because you had not signed it.*

¹ The stem is supposed to have been originally *θρεφ-*, and *θ* reappears when *φ* at the end of the stem is lost in the aorist.

233. If the termination ω of the present is preceded by the two consonants $\pi\tau$, the second of these is rejected, and the first unites as above with the σ of the aorist to form the double consonant ψ . Such verbs are : —

No, it is shut. — My poor sister is a little (*ὀλίγον*) deaf. — You must not cut the green apples; they are not good. — You must cut the bread in small pieces. — Did the boy eat my grapes or yours? He did not eat either mine or yours; he ate his own. — Where is the cook? He is drunk.

These boys are incorrigible, but the girls are quiet. — Is this lady married? No, she is unmarried. — Who (τίς) ordered you to open the door? This gentleman. — Are the horses ready? No, they are not ready yet (ἀκόμη). — Don't tease me! I must read this book. — What have you suffered (what is the matter with you)? Nothing. — Take care, it will rain this evening (ἀπόψε).

267. NOTE 1. — 'Αδειαίζω belongs entirely to the vulgar idiom, and is always conjugated without augment in the past tenses. This is always the case in the vulgar idiom when the augment would require a change of the initial vowel of the stem. The second and third syllables of ἀδειαίζω must be considered as one (εια pronounced *ya*); the same is the case with πλαγιάζω.

269. NOTE 2.— In the vulgar idiom, *καταιβάζω* and *ἐκαταίβασα* are used for *καταβιβάζω* and *κατεβίβασα*, *take down*; *ἀναιβάζω* and *ἀναιβασα* for *ἀναβιβάζω* and *ἀνεβίβασα*, *bring up*.

270. REMARK.— It is useful to remember that all verbs ending in *ζω*, preceded by the sound *ι*, are written with *ι*, except *δανείζω*, *lend*, and *ἀθροίζω* (*συναθροίζω*), *collect*.

wall of the garden.—The doctor did not let me despair (drive me to despair), but he persuaded me to lie down and rest to-day.—You must weigh the fish, you must (not repeated in Greek) salt it, and you must boil it.—I have decided to baptize my child (παιδί) at the (κατά, with acc.) carnival (plural).—As soon as the apples ripen, you must cut them and distribute them to (εἰς) the boys.—Boys (τὰ παιδία) must not smoke.—How much did the queen's carriage cost? I don't know; she didn't buy it, her husband gave it to her (τῇ).

LIQUID VERBS.

281. Ἀνέτειλεν ἡ σελήνη; *Is the moon risen?*
 *Ὁχι, ἀνατέλλει ἀργά. *No, it rises late.*

282. Verbs whose stems ends in λ, μ, ν, ρ (liquid consonants), do not, as a rule, take σ in the aorist, and the vowel or diphthong preceding the liquid characteristic is generally lengthened as follows: αι to α long; ε to ει; and α, ι, υ short to α, ι, υ long. The exceptions to the rule that the aorist of liquid verbs is not formed with σ will be examined in the next lesson.

283. If the present terminates in λω, μνω, or ρνω, the second of the liquids is dropped in the aorist. The following are examples of liquid verbs:—

285. NOTE. — παίρνω, *take*, is a corruption of the verb ἐπαίρω, *lift up*; αι changes here to η because of the augment of the verb αἴρω with which this is compounded. It is better to use the verb λαμβάνω, *take hold of*. — In the last three examples given above, ε does not change to ει.

φέρε μοι (or με) ἓνα ποτῆρι νερό! *bring me a glass of water!*

σὰς συγχαίρω! *I congratulate you!*

περίμενε ὀλίγον! *wait a little!*

δὲν ἠξέύρει τί κάμνει, *he doesn't know what he is doing*
(*what he is about*).

ὑποφέρετε; *are you suffering?*

Other Declensions.

289. All the nouns and adjectives that have not been examined in the preceding lessons are classed in most Greek grammars in one declension,—the third. It is better to subdivide this into four declensions: the third, containing the perittosyllabic nouns; the fourth, the partially perittosyllabic with an uncontracted genitive singular; the fifth, the partially perittosyllabic with contracted genitive singular; and the sixth, containing those nouns of the vulgar idiom which are only perittosyllabic in the plural.

THIRD DECLENSION.

290. The third declension comprises nouns of all three genders ending in α , ν , ξ , ρ , σ , ψ , with the genitive in $-\sigma$.

291. All the cases of these nouns, except the vocative singular, masculine and feminine, and the accusative and vocative singular neuter, have one syllable more than the nominative; for this reason these nouns are known as perittosyllabic.

292. The nouns of this declension are declined according to the following example:—

294. The genitive, dative, and accusative of these nouns are formed simply by adding the proper terminations to the nominative. Except σωτήρ, all these nouns have the vocative in both numbers like the nominative. When the characteristic is ν, it is rejected in the dative plural before the termination σι (*e.g.* ἀγκῶσι, ἀγῶσι, Ἕλλησι).

garments (χιτών) of the soldiers. — I am very glad that the prince gave you his portrait, and I congratulate you from my heart (ἀπὸ καρδίας). — I doubt much if the Greeks will attack the port. — I am waiting to see if you will recognize (ἀναγνωρίζω) who beat you. — The air is very pure here (ἐδῶ, ἐνταῦθα). — Who took the bell? The servant.

304. NOTE 1. — Ἀφίνω comes from ἀφίημι, the classical aorist of which, ἀφῆκα, is also used as an aorist of ἀφίνω or ἀφήνω.

305. NOTE 2. — Instead of πιάνω it is better to use λαμβάνω.

306. NOTE 3. — In the Greek marriage ceremony crowns of orange blossoms are used, hence to crown some one is to give in marriage or to perform the ceremony; e.g.

πότε θὰ στεφανώσης τήν θυγατέρα σου; *when will you crown (give in marriage) your daughter?*

ποῖος ἱερεὺς τοὺς ἐστεφάνωσε; *what priest crowned them (performed the marriage ceremony)?*

307. REMARK. — In all the above verbs ending in *ωνω* the *ν* is not the real characteristic, but is added in the modern vernacular in order to avoid the proximity of two vowels which would be contracted; the Modern Greek language allows contraction only when the characteristic is *α* or *ε*. If this *ν* is dropped these verbs become pure (i.e. have a vowel for characteristic), and we have already seen that pure verbs (ἀκούω, ἤκουσα) always have the aorist in *σα*.

308. ἀφησέ με ἡσυχον! *leave me alone (quiet)!*

ἐθύμωσε καὶ τὸν ἐμάλωσε διότι ἔσπασε τὸ ποτήρι, *he got angry and scolded him because he broke the glass.*

The stem of the last noun appears in the nominative and vocative singular and dative plural as βον-. In some nouns, as in these three examples, the vocative drops -s.

321. NOTE. — In the vulgar idiom the singular of almost all the nouns of the third declension follows the first declension by making a nominative of the accusative and adding σ if the noun is masculine; the plural is always correctly declined according to the third declension; e.g. ἡ νύκτα (for νύξ, *night*), pl. αἱ νύκτες; ἡ σανίδα (for σανίς, *plank*), pl. αἱ σανίδες; ὁ κόρακας (for κόραξ, *crow*), pl. οἱ κόρακες; ὁ ἀέρας or ἀγέρας (for ἀήρ, *air*), pl. οἱ ἀέρες, *winds*, etc.

LESSON XIX.

Προστακτική. — Imperative.

**Εμπειρία*

324. The imperative mood has two tenses, the present and the aorist; the first expressing continuance or repetition, the second the simple occurrence of the action. Both occur only in the second person.

325. The present imperative is formed from the present stem with the endings -ε (sing.) and -ετε (plur.); *e.g.*

Indicative, γράφω, *I write.*

Imperative, γράφε, γράφετε.

The use of the present imperative is not very common.

326. The first aorist imperative is formed from the first aorist stem (unaugmented) with the endings -ον and -ατε; *e.g.*

Indicative, ἔγραφα, *I wrote.*

Imperative, γράψον, γράψατε.

327. The second aorist imperative is formed from the second aorist stem with the endings -ε and -ετε; *e.g.*

Indicative, ἔφαγον, *I ate.*

Imperative, φάγε, φάγετε.

328. The first and third persons of the imperative are borrowed from the subjunctive of the present or aorist, as the case may be, with one of the particles *νά*, *ἄς*, *μὴ*; e.g.

νά τρώγω, νά τρώγῃς, etc., I am to be eating.

νά φάγω, νά φάγῃς, etc., I am to eat.

ἄς φάγω, let me eat; ἄς μὴ φάγω, let me not eat.

μὴ φάγῃς, μὴ φάγητε, don't eat.

329. REMARK. — In verbs compounded with a preposition the accent goes in the imperative as far back as the length of the ultimate will allow; e.g. *προσέχω* (*πρὸς-έχω*), imp. *πρόσεχε*; *ὑπέγραψα* (*ὑπὸ-έγραψα*), imp. *ὑπόγραψον*.

330. NOTE. — In the vulgar idiom it is usual to give the imperative the terminations *-ε*, *-ετε*, whether it is formed from a first or from a second aorist (*γράψε* instead of *γράψον, etc.*).

331. *πίε! drink!*

ἴδε! (also ἰδέ), see!

νά πίη, he is to drink.

ἐπιτρέψατέ μας! allow us!

μὴ πίῃς, don't drink.

τρέξε! run!

ἄς πῶμεν, let us drink.

ἄς μὴ πῶσι, let them not drink.

332. *κόψον αὐτό* (vlg. *κόψε το*), *cut it.*

ἄνοιξον τὴν θύραν (vlg. *ἄνοιξε τὴν πόρταν*), *open the door.*

333. *εἰπὲ εἰς τὸν ἀδελφόν σου*, *tell your brother.*

UNCONTRACTED PURE VERBS.

342. Verbs whose stem ends in a vowel (pure verbs) are of two classes : 1st, uncontracted ; 2d, contracted.

343. Uncontracted pure verbs have the accent (always an acute) on the penultimate in the first person singular of the present indicative, and their characteristic may be any vowel or diphthong except *a*, *ε*, *o*.

344. Contracted verbs have the accent (always a circumflex) on the last syllable in the first person singular of the present indicative, and their characteristic is one of the vowels *a*, *ε*, *o*, which contracts with the termination, as will be seen in the following lessons.

345. The following is a complete paradigm of the active voice of the uncontracted pure verb in Modern Greek : —

346. NOTE. — It will be seen that the present, the imperfect, and the first future in all the moods are formed from the stem as it appears in the present indicative; while the aorist, second future, perfect, pluperfect, and future perfect are formed from the stem as it appears in the aorist indicative. It is sufficient, therefore, to know the present and the aorist of any verb in order to be able to form the other tenses and to conjugate the verb entire.

FOURTH DECLENSION.

348. The fourth declension of nouns contains such as are only partially perittosyllabic (*i.e.* they have only in some

cases one syllable more than in the nominative singular), with the genitive singular uncontracted.

349. The nominative singular of these nouns ends in *εως* and *ις*, and in case of adjectives in *υς* (neuter *υ*). They are declined according to the following examples :—

LESSON XXIII.

402. As remarked in Lesson XVIII., § 307, the vulgar idiom avoids the contraction of verbs ending in *οω* by introducing *ν* between the termination and the characteristic *ο*, so that these verbs become liquid and end in *όνω*, with the aorist in *ωσα*.

SIXTH DECLENSION.

407. The sixth and last declension of Greek nouns belongs exclusively to the vulgar idiom. A great many of these nouns are of foreign origin. They are masculine or feminine; the masculine ending in *as, ης, ους, es,* and the feminine in *ου*. The plural of all these nouns has one syllable more than the singular; this syllable is uniformly

δες for the nominative, accusative, and vocative, and δων for the genitive, and is simply added to the nominative singular, after dropping the final σ in the masculine. There is no dative.

COMPARISON OF ADJECTIVES.

419. The degree of comparison of adjectives is generally indicated by the terminations *-τερος*, *-τερα*, *-τερον* for the comparative, and *-τατος*, *-τατη*, *-τατον* for the superlative, which replace the final *ς* of the positive; *e.g.* *κωφός*, *deaf*, *κωφότερος*, *κωφότατος*.

420. Adjectives ending in *ος* lengthen *ο* to *ω* if the preceding syllable is short; *e.g.* *σοφός*, *wise*, *σοφώτερος*, *σοφώτατος*. They keep the *ο* short if the preceding syllable is long; *e.g.* *μωρός*, *foolish*, *μωρότερος*, *μωρότατος*.

421. Adjectives in *ης*, *εις* add the terminations *-τερος* and *-τατος* to the stem in *εσ-*; *e.g.* *εὐτυχής*, *happy*, *εὐτυχέστερος*, *εὐτυχέστατος*; *χαρίεις*, *graceful*, *χαριέστερος*, *χαριέστατος*. Adjectives in *ων* add *-εστερος* and *-εστατος* to the stem; *e.g.* *εὐδαίμων*, *happy*, *εὐδαιμονέστερος*, *εὐδαιμονέστατος*. Adjectives ending in *ους* simply add the terminations *-τερος* and *-τατος* to their nominative; *e.g.* *ἀπλοῦς*, *simple*, *ἀπλούστερος*, *ἀπλούστατος*.

422. Participles used as adjectives form the comparison by prefixing *μᾶλλον*, *more*, for the comparative, and *μάλιστα*, *most*, or *ἄριστα*, *best*, for the superlative; *e.g.* *πεπαιδευμένος*, *educated*, *μᾶλλον* (or *πλέον*) *πεπαιδευμένος*, *μάλιστα* *πεπαιδευμένος*. In familiar conversation this is often done with all adjectives.

Construction.

423. Comparatives and superlatives take the genitive in the literary language, and the accusative with *ἀπό* or the nominative with *ἤ* or *παρά* in the vulgar idiom; *e.g.*

The son is wiser than the father

may be expressed as follows: —

LESSON XXV.

VERBS (*continued*).

Aorist Passive.

429. It was remarked in the last lesson (§ 415) that the aorist passive of pure verbs is formed from the active by changing the termination *σα* to *θην*. In mute verbs the letter *θ*, being an aspirate, often modifies the characteristic which precedes it; the smooth and middle *π*-mutes (*π*, *β*) and *κ*-mutes (*κ*, *γ*) to their respective aspirates *φ* and *χ*; and the dental mutes (*τ*, *δ*, *θ*) and *ζ*, *σκ*, *ττ*, *σσ*, to *σ*, except in those verbs in *ζω*, *σκω*, *ττω*, *σσω*, given in § 250, which have originally a palatal characteristic; *e.g.*

434. Numbers ending in χιλιάδες or ἑκατομμύρια take in the literary language the genitive, and in the vulgar idiom the nominative; *e.g.* δύο χιλιάδες ἀνδρῶν (ἄνδρες).

445. 17 brigands were hidden in the forest, 41 soldiers were sent to attack them; 16 were taken, but the 17th managed to hide himself and was not found. — I was ordered by (*ὑπό*, gen.) the doctor to wash myself three times a day (gen.). — This island was discovered on the 31st of August, 1892. — The Greek language was taught twice a week (gen.), on Tuesday and Saturday (acc.). — The enemy was three times more numer-

ous (τριπλάσιος) than we (ἡμῶν), but the moment (ἄμα ὥς) we were ordered, we threw ourselves upon them (κατ' αὐτοῦ) twice and thrice,¹ so that they were entirely dispersed.

447. NOTE 1. — The imperative singular of all three conjugations is very rarely used in Modern Greek and is replaced by the subjunctive with *ἄς*; e.g. *ἄς κτυπήσαι, ἄς ζητήσαι, etc.*

448. NOTE 2. — As we remarked in Lesson XXIII. (§ 402), the vulgar idiom avoids the contraction of verbs whose stem ends in *ο* by inserting the consonant *ν* between the stem and the terminations of the present and imperfect. This is also the case in the passive, so that the above verb *χρυσούμαι* becomes in the vulgar idiom *χρυσόβρομαι* and offers no contraction.

449. REMARK. — The formation of the aorist passive offers no difficulty in contract verbs; it suffices to change the active termination *σα* into *θην*; e.g.

Active: κτυπῶ, ἐκτύπησα; ζητῶ, ἐζήτησα; χρυσῶ, ἐχρύσωσα.

Passive: κτυπῶμαι, ἐκτυπήθην; ζητῶμαι, ἐζητήθην; χρυσούμαι, ἐχρυσώθην.

450. Some few of these verbs have the aorist in *σθην*; e.g.

γελῶ, laugh, cheat, ἐγελάσθην; κρεμῶ, hang, ἐκρεμάσθην; etc.

Construction.

454. The nominative of the personal pronouns is expressed only when it is necessary to draw attention to the person ; *e.g.*

ἦλθον, *I came.*

ἐγὼ ἦλθον καὶ ὄχι αὐτός, *I came and not he.*

The oblique cases of these pronouns always precede the verb, except in the imperative ; *e.g.*

σὲ βλέπω, *I see you.* τῷ εἶπον, *I told him.*

εἰπέ μοι, *tell me.*

455. When two pronouns in different cases accompany a verb, the one in the accusative (the direct object of the verb) is placed second ; *e.g.*

δός μοι τό, *give it to me.* μοὶ τὸ ἔδωκε, *he gave it to me.*

When the particles *θά*, *νά*, *ἄν*, *ᾶς*, *etc.*, precede the verb, the personal pronouns are placed after the particle ; *e.g.*

θὰ μοὶ τὸ εἶπη, *he will tell it to me.*

456. The pronoun *αὐτός* and the demonstratives *οὗτος* and *ἐκεῖνος* are placed either before or after the noun ; *e.g.*

αὐτὸς (οὗτος) ὁ ἄνθρωπος, or ὁ ἄνθρωπος αὐτός (οὗτος),
this man.

457. In the vulgar idiom, the genitive of the personal pronouns (*μου*, *σου*, *του*, *etc.*), which has a possessive signification, can be placed either after the substantive or after the adjective which belongs to the substantive ; *e.g.*

ὁ πιστός μου φίλος, or ὁ πιστὸς φίλος μου,
my faithful friend.

ἀφῆνω or ἀφίνω (from ἀφήμι), *leave, let be*: fut. θ' ἀφήσω, aor. ἄφησα and ἀφήκα; imv. pres. ἄφες, ἄφετε, aor. ἄφησε, ἀφήσατε; aor. pass. ἀφέθην.

βλέπω, *see*: fut. θὰ ἴδω, aor. εἶδον; imv. ἴδε and ἰδέ (vlg. διέ, fut. θὰ διῶ).

γίνομαι, *become, be done*: fut. θὰ γίνω, aor. ἔγινα (or θὰ γείνω, ἔγεινα).

δεικνύω (from δείκνυμι), *show*: fut. θὰ δείξω, aor. ἔδειξα.

δίδω (from δίδωμι; vlg. δίνω), *give*: fut. θὰ δώσω, aor. ἔδωσα and ἔδωκα; imv. pres. δίδε, aor. δῶσε, and in the literary language δός, δότε.

εἶμαι, *be*: imperf. ἦμην (conjugation given in §§ 51 and 77).

It is necessary to know also the classical conjugation, which is still much used in writing: pres. ind. εἰμί, εἶ, ἐστί, ἐσμέν, ἐστέ, εἰσί, subj. ὦ, ᾗς, ᾗ, ὦμεν, ᾗτε, ὦσι, imv. ἔσο, ἔστω, ἔστε, ἔστωσαν, inf. εἶναι, partic. ὢν, οὔσα, ὄν; imperf. ἦν, ᾗς, ᾗν, ἦμεν, ᾗτε, ᾗν; fut. ἔσομαι, ἔσῃ, ἔσεται (ἔσται), ἐσόμεθα, ἐσεσθαι, ἔσονται, inf. ἐσεσθαι, partic. ἐσόμενος, ἐσομένη, ἐσόμενον.

εμβαίνω (vlg. μπαίνω), *enter*: fut. θὰ ἔμβω, aor. ἐμβῆκα, imv. ἔμβα. In the same way βγαίνω (from ἐκβαίνω), *go out*: θὰ ἔβγω, ἐβγῆκα, ἔβγα.

ἔρχομαι, *come*: fut. θὰ ἔλθω, aor. ἦλθον, imv. ἐλθέ, and
vlg. ἔλα, ἐλάτε. In the same way ἐξέρχομαι, *go out*;
εἰσέρχομαι, *go in*, etc.

θέτω (from τίθημι), *place, put*: fut. θὰ θέσω, aor. ἔθεσα;
pres. pass. θέτομαι and τίθεμαι, fut. θὰ τεθῶ, aor. ἐτέθην.

κάθημαι, *sit*: fut. θὰ καθίσω, aor. ἐκάθισα (or θὰ καθήσω,
ἐκάθησα); aor. pass. ἐκαθέσθην.

In the same way προσκαλῶ, *invite*; ἀνακαλῶ, *recall*;
ἐπικαλοῦμαι, *invoke*; συγκαλῶ, *convoke*; etc.

λαμβάνω, *get, receive*: fut. θὰ λάβω, 2 aor. ἔλαβον.

λέγω, *say, tell*: fut. θὰ εἴπω, aor. εἶπον; aor. pass. ἐρρέθην
and ἐλέχθην.

πηγαίνω and ὑπάγω, *go*: fut. θὰ ὑπάγω, aor. ὑπῆγα (vlg.
ἐπῆγα), imv. πηγαινε and ὑπαγε.

πίπτω, *fall*: fut. θὰ πέσω, aor. ἔπεσα.

ρίπτω, *throw*: fut. θὰ ρίψω, aor. ἔρριψα (vlg. θὰ ρίξω, ἔρριξα).

σηκόνομαι, *get up*: fut. θὰ σηκωθῶ, aor. ἐσηκώθην, imv.
σήκω, σηκωθῆτε.

στέκομαι (from ἵστημι), *stand*: fut. θὰ σταθῶ, aor. ἐστάθην.

συμβαίνει (impersonal), *it happens*: fut. θὰ συμβῇ, aor.
συνέβη.

τρέχω, *run*: 1 aor. ἔτρεξα, 2 aor. ἔδραμον.

τυγχάνω, *chance, happen*: 2 aor. ἔτυχον.

φαίνομαι, *appear*: fut. θὰ φανῶ, 2 aor. ἐφάνην.

φεύγω, *go away*: fut. θὰ φύγω, 2 aor. ἔφυγον.

χαίρομαι and χαίρω, *rejoice, be glad*: fut. θὰ χαρῶ, 2 aor.
ἔχάρην; pres. imv. χαῖρε, χαίρετε, partic. χαίρων, χαίρουσα,
χαῖρον (vlg. χαρούμενος).

461. A great many Greek verbs are conjugated according to the passive voice, although their signification is active or neuter. Such are

ἀποκρίνομαι, <i>answer.</i>	ὀρκίζομαι, <i>swear.</i>
ἀφικνοῦμαι, <i>arrive.</i>	παραδέχομαι, <i>accept.</i>
ἐνθυμοῦμαι, <i>remember.</i>	παραπονοῦμαι, <i>complain.</i>
ἐντρέπομαι, <i>be ashamed.</i>	περιποιοῦμαι, <i>treat well.</i>
ἔρχομαι, <i>come.</i>	σέβομαι, <i>respect.</i>
εὔχομαι, <i>wish.</i>	σκέπτομαι, <i>think.</i>
δέχομαι, <i>receive.</i>	στέκομαι, <i>stand.</i>
δύναμαι, <i>can.</i>	συλλογίζομαι, <i>think.</i>
κάθηναι, <i>sit.</i>	συλλυποῦμαι, <i>condole.</i>
καταγίνομαι, <i>be occupied in.</i>	συνεννοοῦμαι, <i>come to an</i>
κεῖμαι, <i>lie.</i>	<i>understanding.</i>

462. In the vulgar idiom, verbs in άγω, έγω, ώγω, drop the γ, and also the following vowel or diphthong when this is followed by a consonant. Verbs in αίω drop in the same case the vowel or diphthong following αι. For instance, the verbs κλαίω, *cry*; λέγω, *say*; τρώγω, *eat*; θα φάγω, *I shall eat*, are conjugated as follows:—

κλαίω, κλαῖς, κλαίει, κλαῖμε, κλαῖτε, κλαῖν (for κλαίουν).
 λέω, λές, λέει, λέμε, λέτε, λέν (for λέγουν).
 τρώω, τρῶς, τρώει, τρώμε, τρώτε, τρών (for τρώγουν).
 θὰ φάω, θὰ φᾶς, θὰ φάῃ, θὰ φάμε, θὰ φάτε, θὰ φᾶν
 (for θὰ φάγουν).

PRONOUNS (*continued*).

463. The *possessive pronouns* are

ἐμός, ἐμή, ἐμόν, *mine*.

ἡμέτερος, ἡμετέρα, ἡμέτερον, *our*.

σός, σή, σόν, *thine*.

ὑμέτερος, ὑμετέρα, ὑμέτερον, *your*.

αὐτοῦ, *his, its*; αὐτῆς, *her*; αὐτῶν, *their*.

464. In the vulgar idiom, these nouns are generally replaced by ὁ ἰδικός μου, ὁ ἰδικός σου, ὁ ἰδικός του, *my own, thy own, etc.*

465. REMARK.—The possessive pronouns are often replaced by the genitive of the personal pronoun; *e.g.* ὁ οἶκος μου for ὁ ἐμός οἶκος, *my house*; ὁ ἀδελφός των for ὁ αὐτῶν ἀδελφός, *their brother, etc.*

466. The *interrogative pronoun* is

τίς; (masc. and fem.), τί; (neut.),—gen. τίνος; and in the vulgar idiom, ποῖος; ποία; ποῶν; *who? what?*

τί often replaces all genders and numbers; *e.g.*

τί δάκρυα! *what tears!*

τί συμβουλὰς δὲν τῷ ἔδωκα! *what advice did I not give him!*

467. The *indefinite* and *relative pronouns* are

τις, τὶ, *any*; gen. τινός.

κάτι (κᾶν τι), *something*.

ὅστις, ἥτις, ὅτι, *who* (gen. οὗτινος, ἧστινος, οὐτινος, each part being declined separately).

ὅστισδήποτε, ἡτισδήποτε, ὅτιδήποτε, *whoever*.

468. In the vulgar idiom, ὅστις is replaced by ὁ ὁποῖος, ἡ ὁποία, τὸ ὁποῖον, *who*, and ὅστισδήποτε by ὁποιοσδήποτε, ὁποιαδήποτε, ὁποιονδήποτε, *whoever*.

ὅπου (or ὁποῦ, or ποῦ), *that* (indeclinable), often replaces in the vulgar idiom all genders and numbers of the relative pronoun (not to be confounded with the adverbs ποῦ; *where?* ποῦ, *there*); e.g.

ὁ ποταμὸς ὁποῦ τρέχει, *the river that runs*.

ἡ κόρη ὅπου λατρεύω, *the girl that I adore*.

ἐκεῖνοι ὅπου λέγουσι, *those that say*.

οὐδεὶς, οὐδεμία, οὐδέν in the literary language, and κανείς, καμμία, κανέν in the vulgar idiom, signify *nobody*.

μερικοί, μερικάί, μερικά, *some*; e.g.

μερικοὶ ἄνθρωποι, *some men*.

μερικὰ πράγματα, *some things*.

κάποιος, κάποια, κάποιον in the vulgar idiom, *somebody*.

ὁ, ἡ, τὸ δέινα (indeclinable), *some person*.

469. Other pronouns of *quantity*, *quality*, etc., are

πόσος; *how much?* τόσος, *so much*. ὅσος, *as much*.

τοιούτος, τοιαύτη, τοιοῦτο, *such a one*.

τοσοῦτος, τοσαύτη, τοσοῦτο, *so great*.

ὁ ἑαυτός μου, ὁ ἑαυτός σου, etc., *myself, thyself*.

ἄλλος, *another*. ἄλληλοι, *each other*.

ἕτερος, ἑτέρα, ἕτερον, *other*.

470. To which may be added the adjectives

ὅλος, ὅλη, ὅλον, *all*.

ὁλόκληρος, ὅ, ἡ, ὁλόκληρον, τό, *entire, the whole*.

πᾶς (gen. παντός), πᾶσα, πᾶν, *every one, all*.

λοιπός, λοιποί, *the rest, etc.*

EXERCISES.

472. Leave him alone (quiet, ἡσυχον), whoever he may be (καὶ ἂν εἶναι). — Who told you this? Your father told it to ours. — Who is going to (the) town? He who came yesterday. — They gave me the books which they had got this morning (σήμερον τὸ πρωῒ). — I am ashamed to see you sitting when all the rest are

standing. — Come here and tell me if this is yours !
No, it is not mine, it is theirs. — What o'clock (τί ὥρα)
is it ? It is half-past seven (ἐπταὶ καὶ μισή). — Those
that were invited came and sat at his table. — What has
become (of) the letter which I threw into the garden ?
The wind took it (τὸ ἐπῆρε) and it fell into the river. —
I received your letter and I come to tell you that I am
ashamed of you (δι' ὑμᾶς). — What ?

LESSON XXVIII.

Προθέσεις. — PREPOSITIONS.

473. The *prepositions* of the Modern Greek language are the following:—

ἀντί, ἀπό, ἐκ, πρό, which take the genitive.

ἐν, σύν, which take the dative.

ἀνά, εἰς, which take the accusative.

διά, ἐπί, κατά, μετά, παρά, περί, ὑπό, ὑπέρ, which take either the genitive or the accusative.

πρός, which takes either the dative or the accusative.

We will examine each of these in the above order.

474.

1. With the Genitive.

ἀντί (before a vowel with the aspirate ἀνθ'), *instead of*:
e.g. ἀντ' ἐμοῦ, *instead of me*.

ἀπό (before a vowel with the aspirate ἀφ'), *from, by, since*:
e.g. ἀπ' Ἀθηνῶν εἰς Πειραιᾶ, *from Athens to the Piræus*;
τὸν ἔλαβεν ἀπὸ τῆς χειρός, *he took him by the hand*; ἀπὸ τοῦ παρελθόντος μηνός, *since last month*. In the vulgar idiom ἀπό always take the acc.; e.g. ἀπὸ τὰς Ἀθήνας, ἀπὸ τὴν χεῖρα, ἀπὸ τὸν παρελθόντα μῆνα.

ἐκ (before a vowel ἐξ), *of, from*: e.g. ἐκ σιδήρου, *made of iron*;
πάσχει ἐκ ποδάγρας, *he suffers from gout*; ἦλθεν ἐκ Πατρῶν, *he came from Patras*; ἐξ ἐκείνου τοῦ χρόνου, *from that time*; εἰς ἐκ τῶν δύο, *one of the two*.

πρό, *before, in front of*: e.g. πρὸ παντὸς ἄλλου, *before everything else*; πρὸ τῆς οἰκίας, *in front of the house*. Πρό does not suffer elision in composition; e.g. πρόοδος, *progress*.

475

2. With the Dative.

ἐν, *in, into*: e.g. ἐν τῷ κόσμῳ, *in the world*; ἐν τούτοις, *in the meantime*. In composition the ν becomes μ before β, π, φ; it becomes γ before κ, γ, χ; and before λ, μ, ρ it changes into one of these letters; e.g. ἐμβαίνω, ἐμπίπτω, ἔμφυτον, ἐγκαύχημα, ἔγγαμος, ἐγχειρίδιον, ἐλλημενίζομαι, ἐμμανής, ἐρράπτω.

σύν, *with*: e.g. σὺν ὑμῖν, *with you*. In composition the ν changes as in ἐν; e.g. συμβαίνει, συγγενής, συλλογή, συρρόή, etc.

476.

3. With the Accusative.

ἀνά, *by*: e.g. ἀνὰ εἰς, *one by one*; ἀνὰ δύο, *two by two*. Also *over* in the sense of space; e.g. ἀνὰ πᾶσαν τὴν χώραν, *over the whole land*.

εἰς, *to, in, at*: e.g. ὑπάγω εἰς Ἀθήνας, *I go to Athens*; ἔπεσεν εἰς τὴν θάλασσαν, *he fell into the sea*; ἦμην εἰς τὸ θεάτρον, *I was at the theatre*; εἴμεθα εἰς τοῦ Γεωργίου (τὴν οἰκίαν), *we were at George's (house)*.

477.

4. With the Genitive and the Accusative.

διὰ (vlg. γιὰ). 1. With gen., *by, through, with*: e.g. ἦλθε διὰ θαλάσσης, *he came by sea*; διῆλθε διὰ τῆς πόλεως, *he passed through the town*. 2. With acc., *for*: e.g. ἀπέθανε διὰ τὴν πατρίδα, *he died for his country*; ἀνεχώρησε διὰ Κέρκυραν, *he left for Corfu*. 3. With the subj., *in order to*: e.g. διὰ νὰ ἴδω, *in order to see*.

ἐπὶ (before a vowel with the aspirate ἐφ'). 1. With gen., *on, at the time of*: e.g. ἵσταται ἐπὶ τῆς γεφύρας, *he is standing on the bridge*; ἐπὶ Ἀλεξάνδρου τοῦ Μεγάλου, *at the time (or under the reign) of Alexander the Great*. 2. With acc., *during*: e.g. ἐπὶ τρία ἔτη, *during three years*. Ἐπὶ is also sometimes used with the dative to indicate the condition, etc.

κατά (before a vowel with the aspirate καθ'). 1. With gen., *against*: e.g. κατὰ τοῦ ἐχθροῦ, *against the enemy*. 2. With acc., *according to, about*: e.g. κατὰ τὴν συμβουλήν σας, *according to your advice*; καθ' ᾧ λέγεις, *according to what you say*; κατ' ἐκείνους τοὺς καιροὺς, *about (in) those times*.

μετά (before a vowel with the aspirate μεθ'). 1. With gen., *with*: e.g. μετ' αὐτοῦ, *with him* (in the vulgar idiom this preposition is written μέ, and always takes the acc.; e.g. μὲ αὐτόν, *with him*). 2. With acc., *after*: e.g. μετ' αὐτόν, *after him*; μετὰ τρεῖς ἡμέρας, *after three days*.

παρά. 1. With gen., *from*: e.g. τὸ ἔλαβον παρ' αὐτοῦ, *I received it from him*. 2. With acc., *by, against, less*: e.g. παρὰ τὴν θάλασσαν, *by the sea*; παρὰ φύσιν, *contrary to nature*; μία ὥρα παρὰ δύο λεπτά, *one hour less two minutes*; παρὰ τέταρτον, *a quarter to*.

περί. 1. With gen., *about, on*: e.g. ὁμιλεῖ περὶ θρησκείας, *he is speaking on religion*. 2. With acc., *about, around*: e.g. φέρει ταινίαν περὶ τὴν κεφαλὴν, *he wears a riband around the head*. Περί does not lose the ι before a vowel in composition; e.g. περιέργος, *curious*.

ὑπό (before a vowel with the aspirate ὑφ'). 1. With gen., *by*: e.g. ἐστάλη ὑπὸ τοῦ Γεωργίου, *it was sent by George*. 2. With acc., *under*: e.g. ὑπὸ τὴν γῆν, *under the earth*.

ὑπέρ. 1. With gen., *for*: e.g. πολεμεῖ ὑπὲρ πατρίδος, *he fights for his country*; εὐχομαι ὑπὲρ τῆς ὑγείας σου, *I wish for your (good) health*. 2. With acc., *above, more than*: e.g. ἐθαυμάσθη ὑπὲρ πάντας, *he was admired above all*; ὑπὲρ τὴν γῆν, *above the earth*; ἦσαν ὑπὲρ τοὺς δώδεκα, *they were more than twelve*.

478. 5. With the Dative and the Accusative.

πρός. 1. With dat., *next to*; e.g. πρὸς τούτοις, *next to these*. 2. With acc., *towards*; e.g. πρὸς Ἀνατολάς, *towards the East*.

Ἐπεσε κατὰ τὴν μάχην τοῦ Μαραθῶνος, πολεμῶν ὑπὲρ πατρίδος, καὶ ἐτάφη ἐν Ἀθήναις ὑπὸ τὴν σκιὰν τοῦ ναοῦ τοῦ Θησέως. — Μετ' αὐτὸν ἦλθον τρεῖς στρατιῶται μεθ' ἑνὸς ἀξιωματικοῦ, εἰς ἑξ αὐτῶν ἦτο συγγενής μου. — Ἀπὸ τοῦ παρελθόντος μηνὸς πᾶσχει ἐκ διφθερίτιδος. — Ἐπὶ Ναπολέοντος τοῦ πρώτου ἐφονεύθησαν ἐν πολέμῳ ὑπὲρ τὸ ἑκατομμύριον ἀνδρῶν. — Ἀπὸ τῆς στιγμῆς ἐκείνης περὶ οὐδενὸς ἄλλου ἐσκεπτόμην ἢ περὶ τῆς υἱείας μου. — Τὸ ξίφος τοῦτο εἶναι ἐκ χάλυβος καὶ ἀργύρου. — Ἀναχωρήσας ἐκ Μασσαλίας ἦλθεν εἰς Πειραιᾶ διὰ θαλάσσης. — Πρὸ τούτου ἔλαβε παρὰ τοῦ βασιλέως χρυσὴν ταινίαν ἣν ἔβαλε περὶ τὴν κεφαλὴν. — Ὑπὸ τὴν πέτραν ταύτην κεῖται ὁ ὑπὲρ πατρίδος πεσών. — Πρὸς Ἀνατολὰς τῆς πόλεως ἴσταται λόφος ἐφ' οὗ (εἰσὶ) δένδρα ὑψηλά. — Οὐδ' ἐπὶ στιγμὴν ἀμφέβαλον περὶ τῆς ἀληθείας τῶν λόγων του. — Πρὸ παντὸς ἄλλου πρέπει νὰ λέγῃς τὴν ἀλήθειαν. — Ἦσαν πέντε σὺν τῷ διδασκάλῳ αὐτῶν, μετ' αὐτοὺς δὲ (*and*) ἦλθον ἕτεροι τρεῖς.

480. The letters came from Patras by sea to the Piraeus. — According to our orders we marched against the enemy. — After his death he was buried under the trees next to the house. — I went to the theatre instead of my friend at a quarter to eight. — From that moment he hid under the table and remained there for (during) three hours less ten minutes. — From this wood was

built (ἐκτίσθη) the bridge on which we stand. — Before me my friend spoke more than an hour against this idea (ιδέας). — They entered two by two, together with the teacher, who was walking in front of them, and they sat under the trees towards the East. They started (ἀνεχώρησαν) with him, but they arrived (ἀφίχθησαν) after him. — I am neither with you nor against you ; I fight for my country.

LESSON XXIX.

Ἐπιρρήματα. — ADVERBS.

481. Adverbs of manner and kind are formed from the genitive plural of adjectives by changing *ν* to *σ*; *e.g.*

καλός, καλῶν, adv. καλῶς, *well*.

In the vulgar idiom the nominative plural of the neuter is used as an adverb; *e.g.*

καλόν, καλά, adv. καλά, *well*.

482. These adverbs have their three degrees of comparison.

The comparative is the nominative singular (in the vulgar idiom the nominative plural) of the neuter comparative of the adjective; *e.g.*

καλός, καλήτερος, adv. καλήτερον (vlg. καλήτερα), *better*.

The superlative is the nominative plural of the neuter superlative of the adjective; *e.g.*

κάλλιστα, *best*.

In the same way, ἐνδόξως, *gloriously*, ἐνδοξώτερον, ἐνδοξώτατα; εὐθύμως, *gaily*, εὐθυμώτερον, εὐθυμώτατα; *etc.*

483. Besides adverbs formed from adjectives, there are many others; these may be subdivided into

1. Adverbs of place;
2. Adverbs of time;
3. Adverbs of manner and kind;
4. Undefined.

484.

1. Adverbs of Place.

These adverbs take the gen. ; *e.g.*

ἄνω τοῦ δάσους, *above the forest.*

ἔξω τῆς πόλεως, *outside the town.*

In the vulgar idiom the accusative with the preposition ἀπό is generally used ; *e.g.*

ἔξω ἀπὸ τὴν πόλιν.

485. The following are the most commonly used adverbs of place : —

ἄνω (vlg. ἐπάνω), *above, on.*

ἄλλαχοῦ (vlg. ἄλλου), *in another place* ; πανταχοῦ (vlg. παντοῦ), *everywhere.*

ἐνταῦθα, ἐδῶ, *here* ; ἐκεῖ, *there.* The termination *θεν* means *from* a place ; *σε, δε, ζε, to* a place ; *σι, in* a place ; *e.g.* ἐντεῦθεν, *from here* ; ἐκεῖθεν, *from there* ; ἐκεῖσε, *to that place* ; Ἀθήνησι, *in Athens* ; *etc.*

ἔξω (vlg. ἀπέξω), *out* ; ἐκτός, *outside, except* ; *e.g.* ἐκτὸς τῆς πόλεως, *outside the town* ; ἐκτὸς τούτου, *except this.* In the latter sense also πλὴν ; *e.g.* πλὴν ἐμοῦ, *except me.*

ἔσω (vlg. μέσα, ἀπομέσα), ἐντός, *within.*

ἐμπρός (vlg. ἐμπροστά), *forward* ; ἐνώπιον, *in front of.*

κάτω, *down* ; κάτωθεν (vlg. ἀποκάτω), *under* ; *e.g.* κάτωθεν τῆς τραπέζης (vlg. ἀποκάτω ἀπὸ τὸ τραπέζι), *under the table.*

μακράν (vlg. μακρὰ), *far* ; μακρόθεν, *from far* ; ἐγγύς, πλησίον (vlg. κοντά), *near* ; ἀπέναντι, ἀντικρὺ, *opposite.*

μεταξύ, *between.*

ὀπίσω, *back* ; ὀπισθεν (vlg. ἀποπίσω), *from behind* ; *e.g.* ὕπαγε ὀπίσω, *go back* ; λαμβάνω ὀπίσω, *I take back* ; τὸν ἐκτύπησεν ἀποπίσω (ἐκ τῶν ὀπισθεν), *he struck him from behind.*

οἱκοι, *at home*; οἶκοθεν, *from home* (in the literary language also with the meaning of *as a matter of course*); οἶκαδε, *toward home*.

ποῦ; *where?* ποῦ καὶ ποῦ, *here and there*; κάπου, *somewhere*; ὅπου, *wherever*; οὐδαμοῦ (vlg. πουθενά, πούπετα), *nowhere*.

486.

2. Adverbs of Time.

αἴφνης, αἰφνιδίως (vlg. ἔξαφνα), *suddenly*.

ἄμα, *as soon as*, takes the dat.; e.g. ἄμα τῇ πρωΐᾳ, *as soon as it was morning*. Verbs following ἄμα are put in the subjv., and are preceded in the literary language by ὥς; e.g. ἄμα ὥς τελειώσῃ, *as soon as he has finished*.

ἀμέσως, *immediately*; εὐθύς, *at once*.

ἀκόμη, εἰσέτι, *yet, still*.

ἄργά, *late*; ἐνωρίς, *early*.

ἕως, μέχρι, *up to, as far as*, take the gen.; e.g. ἕως τῆς ὥρας ταύτης, *up to this hour*; ἕως τώρα, μέχρι τοῦδε, *up to this*.

ἤδη, πλέον (vlg. πειά), *already*; e.g. εἶχεν ἤδη ἀναχωρήσει, *he had already left*.

μόλις, *scarcely, hardly*.

πότε; *when?* πάντοτε, *always*; ἐνίποτε (vlg. κάποτε), *sometimes*; ἄλλοτε, *in other times*; ἔκτοτε (vlg. ἀποτότε), *ever since*.

ποτέ, *never, once*; e.g. δὲν τὸ εἶπον ποτέ, *I never said it*; τὸ εἶπον ποτέ, *I said it sometime*; οὐδέποτε, *never once*.

πολλάκις, συχνάκις (vlg. πολλὰς φορές, συχνά), *often*.

πρίν, πρὸ τοῦ, *before*. Also πρότερον (vlg. προτῆτερα).

τότε, *then*; ὅταν, *when*.

487. There are also numerous adverbial expressions of time, some of the most usual of which are the following : —

ἀπὸ καιροῦ εἰς καιρόν, *from time to time.*

πρὸς τὸ παρόν, ἐπὶ τοῦ παρόντος, ἐν τῷ μεταξύ,
ἐν τοσοῦτῳ, *in the meantime.*

ὥς ἐπὶ τὸ πολὺ, ὥς ἐπὶ τὸ πλεῖστον, *more or less.*

ἐπὶ τέλους, τέλος, *finally.*

διὰ παντός, *for ever, by all means.*

διὰ νυκτός, *by night.*

θάπτον ἢ βράδιον, *earlier or later.*

κατ' ἀρχάς (vlg. ὅσπιν ἀρχήν), *in the beginning.*

ἐντὸς ὀλίγου, *shortly.*

εἰς τὸ ἐξῆς (vlg. τοῦ λοιποῦ), *in the future.*

ἐν τῷ ἄμα, *immediately.*

καθ' ἐκάστην, καθ' ἡμέραν (vlg. κάθε μέρα),
every day.

ἡμέρα παρ' ἡμέραν, *every other day.*

κατ' αὐτάς, αὐτὰς τὰς ἡμέρας, *in these days.*

3. Adverbs of Manner and Kind.

ἄλλως (vlg. ἀλλέως, ἀλλοιῶς, ἀλλοιώτικα), *in another way.*

οὕτως, τοιουτοτρόπως (vlg. ἔτσι), *thus; ἔτσι κ' ἔτσι, so-so.*

ὅπως, ὥς, καθὼς (vlg. σάν, ὡσάν), *as.*

ὅπως δὴ ποτε (vlg. ὅπως καὶ ἂν εἶναι), *however.*

πῶς; *how?*

489.

4. Undefined.

ἀλλοίμονον! *alas!* takes the preposition *εἰς*; *e.g.* ἀλλοίμονον εἰς σέ! *alas for you!*

ἄνευ, χωρίς, δίχως, *without*, take the gen.; *e.g.* ἄνευ ὑμῶν, *without you*. In the vulgar idiom the two last take the acc.; *e.g.* χωρίς ἀμφιβολίαν, *without doubt*; δίχως ἄλλο, (*without anything else*) *certainly*.

ἄπαξ, δίς, τρίς, *etc.*, numeral adverbs, are followed by the gen. of the time within which; *e.g.* δις τοῦ ἔτους, *twice a year*.

ἄρα, ἄραγε, τάχα, *therefore*; λοιπόν, ἐπομένως, ἀκολουθῶς, *then, consequently*.

βεβαίως (vlg. βέβαια), *certainly*.

δέν, *not* (abbreviation of οὐδέν, *nothing*); *e.g.* δὲν θέλω, *I do not wish*.

διόλου, καθόλου, *not at all*; ἐξ ἁπαντος, *absolutely*.

ἰδοῦ, *there!* *e.g.* ἰδοὺ αὐτός, *there he is*. In the vulgar idiom νά; νάτος, νάτη, νάτο, stand for νὰ αὐτός, νὰ αὐτή, *etc.*, *there he is*.

ἴσως, *perhaps*; ἴσια (vlg.), *straight*; ἴσια ἴσια, *just so*.

μά, *but* (from the Italian *ma*); *e.g.* μὰ διατί ἔφυγες; *but why did you go away?* In adjurations, *by*; *e.g.* μὰ τὸν θεόν! *by God!*

μή, *not* (before a vowel μὴν), with the subjv.; *e.g.* μὴ φύγῃς, *don't go*. μή or μήπως has also the meaning of *lest*, and, in interrogative phrases, *perhaps?* *e.g.* μήπως ἦλθε; *did he perhaps come?*

ναί, μάλιστα, *yes*.

σχεδόν, *almost*.

(For a more complete list of adverbs see Vocab. XXXIII.)

He could go neither forward nor backward, but remained there until night. — Probably he had already arrived there before you left. — Nobody except me knows this. — Since that day I have never believed him. — The boy stupidly ran away the moment he saw me. — You did very well to send him back without further (*ἐτέρας*) discussion. — He said rightly that it was better not to see him at all. — Was he perhaps (*μήπως*) afraid of you? Not at all, he is very brave. — Come here immediately, don't be afraid! — Alas! I am without a cent (*ὀβολός*). — I scarcely recognized you because it was dark. — Where is he, where did he come from, and where is he going to?

¹ Instead of *ὀρίσате!* *command!* — *Ὀρίστε* takes the meaning of *at your service, come in, take a seat, etc.*

LESSON XXX.

Σύνδεσμοι. — CONJUNCTIONS.

492. The chief conjunctions of the Greek language are:—

καί, *and*. In the vulgar idiom it sometimes stands for *that*; e.g. τί ἔκαμον καὶ μὲ μαλόνεις; *what did I do that you should scold me?* καίτοι (vlg. ἂν καί), *although*. καὶ καλά, *by all means, absolutely*. τέ in the literary language immediately follows a noun, pronoun, or verb, and precedes καί; e.g. ἐγὼ τε καὶ σύ, *I and you*.

μὲν . . . δέ, *indeed . . . but*. These conjunctions unite phrases placed in opposition to each other; e.g. τὸν εἶδον μὲν, δὲν τὸν ἐγνώρισα δέ, *I saw him indeed, but I did not recognize him*. δέ alone means *and*; e.g. ἦσαν τρεῖς, μετ' αὐτοὺς δὲ ἕτεροι τρεῖς, *they were three, and after them three more*.

ἀλλά, *but*; ὅμως, *however*; ἀλλ' ὅμως, πλὴν, *but, still*; οὐχ' ἥττον ὅμως, *nevertheless*.

ἢ . . . ἢ, εἴτε . . . εἴτε, *either . . . or*.

οὔτε . . . οὔτε, μήτε, μηδέ, *neither . . . nor*.

ἂν, εἰάν, *if*, take the subjv., or the impf. and plup. indic. καὶν (καὶ ἂν), *at least*.

ἄς (abbreviation of ἄφες, *let*) takes the subjv., giving it an imperative sense; e.g. ἄς ἔλθῃ, *let him come*. With the impf. and plup. it signifies a wish (ancient opt.); e.g. ἄς ἦρχετο! *would that he might come!*

νά (abbreviation of the adverb ἵνα, which also is used in the literary language), *that*, takes (1) the pres. subjv., giving it an infinitive sense; *e.g.* θέλω νὰ ὑπάγω, *I wish to go*;— (2) the impf. and plup. indic., and signifies a wish like ἄς;— (3) the aor. subjv., giving it an imperative sense; *e.g.* νὰ τῷ εἴπῃς, *you are to tell him*.

θά (from θέλω ἵνα), *will*, (1) precedes the pres., the aor., and the perf. subjv., in order to form the first and second fut. and the fut. perf.;— (2) with the impf. and plup. it forms the conditional; *e.g.* θὰ ἤρχόμην, *I should have come*.

ὅτι, πῶς, *that*, take the indic.; *e.g.* ἤκουσα ὅτι λέγει, *I heard that he says*;— μοι εἶπε πῶς εἶναι καλήτερα, *he told me that he is better*.

ὅταν, *when*, takes the subjv., or the impf. and plup. indic.— ὅτε, *when*, not to be confounded with ὅ, τε, neut. rel. pronoun.

ἀφοῦ (ἀφ' οὗ), (1) with the subjv., *after*; *e.g.* ἀφοῦ φύγῃ, *after he is gone*;— (2) with the indic., *since*; *e.g.* ἀφ' οὗ τὸ θέλεις, *since you wish it*. ἀφ' οὗτον, *ever since, since then*. ἐνῶ (ἐν ᾧ), *while*.

ἐπειδὴ, διότι, *because*. ἐπειδὴ refers to a cause which follows, διότι to one which precedes; *e.g.* ἐπειδὴ τὸν γνωρίζω, τὸν ἀγαπῶ; τὸν ἀγαπῶ διότι τὸν γνωρίζω.

ὥστε, *so that, consequently*; *e.g.* τὸν εἶδον, ὥστε τὸν γνωρίζω, *I saw him, and consequently I know him*.

(For a complete list of the conjunctions see Vocab. XXXIV.)

494. Both you and I are in the wrong. — Although you say so, I can scarcely believe you; however, I will try to do as you wish. — I met him indeed, but I did not know him because he has changed much since I saw him last. — When the clock strikes twelve, bring the dinner (*τὸ φαγητόν*), whether they have come or not. — As soon as you have eaten call me, before you begin your work, because I want to inspect what you have already done. — I wrote to him at once in order that he should receive my letter before leaving his house. — I am also of the same opinion.

Ἐν Ἐλευσίνι, ὅτε οἱ ὑπὸ τὸν Στρατηγὸν Καραϊσκάκην, μαθόντες τὴν ἔλευσιν ἰσχυρᾶς τουρκικῆς δυνάμεως, ἤρχισαν νὰ λειποτακτῶσι καὶ παρεκίνουν καὶ αὐτὸν νὰ φύγῃ, “ὑπάγετε, ἀνέκραξεν οὗτος, ὅπου θέλετε, ὁ Καραϊσκάκης δὲν ἀφήνει τὴν θέσιν του”· ὅταν σὰς ἐρωτήσουν “τί ἐκάματε τὸν ἀρχηγόν σας,” ἀποκριθῆτε “τὸν παρεδώκαμεν εἰς τὸν ἐχθρόν, διότι δὲν συγκατένευε νὰ λειποτακτήσῃ.”

Ἀνθρωπὸς τις εἶχε δύο υἱούς, ὧν ὁ μὲν ἠγάπα τὸν ὕπνον καὶ ἐκοιμᾶτο καθ’ ὅλην τὴν πρωΐαν, ὁ δὲ ἦν φίλεργος καὶ ἠγειρέτο πάντοτε λίαν ἐνωρίς. Ἡμέραν τινα, ἐξελθὼν οὗτος ἐνωρίτατα, εὔρε καθ’ ὁδὸν βαλάντιον πλή-

ρες χρημάτων. Ἔδραμεν ἀμέσως πρὸς τὸν ἀδελφόν του καὶ, ἐξυπνήσας αὐτόν, τῷ ἀνήγγειλε τὴν καλὴν του τύχην λέγων “βλέπεις τί κερδίζει τις ἐγειρόμενος ἐνωρίς,” ὁ δὲ ἀπεκρίθη, “ἐὰν ὁ κύριος τοῦ βαλαντίου ἐκοιμᾶτο ἀκόμη, δὲν θὰ εἶχεν ἀπολέσει τὸ βαλάντιόν του.”

Γερμανὸς τις, ἐλθὼν κατὰ πρώτην φορὰν ἐν Ἑλλάδι καὶ ἀκούσας τὰ παιδία νὰ ὁμιλῶσι τὴν ἑλληνικὴν ἐν ταῖς ὁδοῖς, ἀνέκραξε· “Πῶς, εἶναι δυνατόν; καὶ τὰ παιδία ἀκόμη ὁμιλοῦσι τὴν ἑλληνικὴν ἐνταῦθα!”

νὰ μὴ χάνῃ στιγμήν· διότι, ἔλεγε μὲ τὸν νοῦν της, ἔχουσα καὶ εὐχαρίστησιν μεγάλην· “Εργάζομαι χάριν τῆς καλῆς μητρός μου, ἡ ὁποία ἀσθενεῖ, καὶ τὰ χρήματα τὰ ὁποῖα θὰ κερδίσω ἀπὸ αὐτὰς τὰς φράουλας θὰ τὴν ἀνακουφίσωσιν ὀλίγον.”

“Ὅτε ἡ Χριστίνα εἶδεν ὅτι ἤρχισε νὰ νυκτόνη, ἐκίνησεν ὅπως ἐπανέλθῃ εἰς τὴν οἰκίαν μὲ τὸ καλάθιον της γεμάτον ἀπὸ φράουλας καὶ περασμένον εἰς τὸν βραχίονά της. Ἦρχισε νὰ βρέχῃ, βρονταὶ δὲ ἠκούοντο μακρόθεν. Μόλις ἐξῆλθεν ἀπὸ τὸ δάσος καὶ σφοδρὸς ἄνεμος ἠγέρθῃ· ἡ βροχὴ ἠῤῥξανεν, ὁ δὲ οὐρανός, ὅστις εἶχε βαθὺ ἐρυθρὸν χρῶμα πρὸς δυσμάς, ἐσκοτίσθη πανταχόθεν ἀπὸ φοβερὰ σύννεφα ἐπισωρευόμενα τὸ ἐν κατόπιν τοῦ ἄλλου. Ἡ Χριστίνα ἀπέφευγεν ἐπιμελῶς τοῦ νὰ πλησιάσῃ εἰς τὰ μεγάλα δένδρα, προεφυλάττετο δὲ ὀπισθεν τῶν θάμνων καὶ ἀνέμενε νὰ παύσῃ ἡ καταιγίς.

Αἰφνιδίως ἤκουσεν εἰς τὸ πλησίον δάσος μίαν παραπονετικὴν φωνήν, ὁμοίαν μὲ φωνὴν μικροῦ παιδίου. Ἡ Χριστίνα ἦτο τόσον ἐλεήμων καὶ καλή, ὥστε οὔτε ἡ βροχὴ, οὔτε αἱ ἀστραπαί, οὔτε ὁ κρότος τοῦ κεραυνοῦ ἠδυνήθησαν νὰ τὴν ἐμποδίσωσιν ἀπὸ τοῦ νὰ ὑπάγῃ νὰ ἴδῃ τὴν συνέβαινε. Προχωρήσασα λοιπὸν εἰς τὸ δάσος ἐξεπλάγῃ πολὺ ἰδοῦσα ἐν ταλαίπωρον μικρὸν ἀρνίον κάθυγρον, τρέμον ἐκ τοῦ ψύχους, καὶ μὴ ἔχον ποῦ νὰ ὑπάγῃ. “ὦ καυμένο προβατάκι! εἶπεν ἡ Χριστίνα κατασυγκεκινημένη, δὲν θὰ χαθῇς· ἔλα νὰ σὲ ὑπάγω εἰς τὴν οἰκίαν.” Ἐλαβε δὲ τῷ ὄντι εἰς τὰς ἀγκάλας της τὸ ἀρνίον, καὶ ἦλθε μετ’ αὐτοῦ εἰς τὴν οἰκίαν ἀμέσως μετὰ τὴν βροχήν.

“ὦ! ἰδέ, μῆτερ, ἀνέκραξεν ἐνῶ εἰσῆρχετο, ἰδέ, σὲ παρακαλῶ, τὴν εὐρον πρὸ ὀλίγου! Ἐν ὥραϊον ἀρνάκι!

Πόσον εἶμαι εὐτυχής! Πῶς θὰ τὸ περιποιούμαι! Θὰ ᾔναι ἡ χαρά μου.” — “Κόρη μου, τῇ εἶπεν ἡ μήτηρ της, ἐγειρομένη ἐκ τῆς κλίνης καὶ στηρίζουσα τὴν κεφαλὴν ἐπὶ τοῦ βραχίονός της, λησμονεῖς, ἐν τῇ χαρᾷ σου, ὅτι τὸ ἀρνίον αὐτὸ θὰ ἔχῃ κύριον. Ἐχάθη καὶ ἔχομεν καθῆκον νὰ τὸ ἐπιστρέψωμεν. Θὰ ᾔναι βεβαίως τοῦ πλουσίου χωρικοῦ τοῦ γειτονικοῦ κτήματος. Πήγαινέ το εἰς αὐτὸν εὐθύς σήμερον· διότι ποτὲ δὲν πρέπει νὰ κρατῶμεν εἰς τὴν οἰκίαν μας τὸ ξένον πράγμα, οὐδ’ ἐπὶ μίαν μόνον νύκτα.”

“Δὲν ἐννοεῖτε τὸ συμφέρον σας! ἀνέκραξε κατὰ τὴν αὐτὴν στιγμὴν ἐκ τοῦ παραθύρου εἰς κτίστης, ὅστις ἐπεσκεύαζε τὸν τοίχον τοῦ κήπου καὶ εἶχεν ἀκούσει τὴν συνομιλίαν των, δὲν πρέπει νὰ ἦσθε τόσον δειλαί.”

Ἡ μήτηρ καὶ ἡ θυγάτηρ ἐστράφησαν ἔντρομοι καὶ τὸν παρετήρησαν μετ’ ἐκπλήξεως. “Μὴ φοβῆσθε, προσέθεσεν ὁ κτίστης, ὁμιλῶ σπουδαίως· ἄς σφάξωμεν αὐτὸ τὸ ζῶον καὶ ἄς τὸ μοιρασθῶμεν· τὸ κρέας του θὰ μᾶς προμηθεύσῃ καλὰ τεμάχια ψητοῦ, καὶ ἀπὸ τὸ δέρμα του θὰ κερδίσωμεν ὀλίγα χρήματα. Ὁ χωρικὸς ἔχει ὑπὲρ τὰ ἑκατὸν ἀρνία· ἐν πλειότερον ἢ ὀλιγώτερον τί σημαίνει; ἄς σφάξωμεν τοῦτο ἐδώ. Δὲν ἔχετε τίποτε νὰ φοβηθῆτε, κανεῖς δὲν θὰ σᾶς ἴδῃ· ἡμπορεῖτε νὰ ἐμπιστευθῆτε εἰς ἐμέ. Θὰ μείνω ἄφωνος, καθὼς αὐτὸς ὁ τοίχος.” Λέγων δὲ τὰς λέξεις ταύτας, ἔρριψεν ἐπὶ τοῦ τοίχου τὸν ἀσβέστην τοῦ μυστηρίου του.

Ἡ Χριστίνα ἔφριξεν, ὅτε ἤκουσε τοὺς λόγους τούτους, ἐπειδὴ ἐφάνησαν εἰς αὐτὴν ἀποτρόπαιοι. “Μᾶς συμβουλεύεις μίαν ἀδικίαν! εἶπεν εἰς τὸν κτίστην· ὅ,τι δὲν βλέπουν οἱ ἄνθρωποι, ὁ Θεὸς τὸ βλέπει. Ἡ μήτηρ μου ἔχει μέγα δίκαιον, θαυμάζω δὲ πῶς δὲν ἐσκέφθην ταχύτερον

νὰ ἐπιστρέψω τὸ μικρὸν αὐτὸ ἀρνίον εἰς τὸν κύριόν του·
βεβαίως θὰ ἐλάβανον μεγάλην εὐχαρίστησιν νὰ τὸ κρα-
τήσω, προσέθεσε χύνουσα ὀλίγα δάκρυα, ἀλλὰ πρέπει νὰ
ὑπακούωμεν εἰς τὸν Θεόν.”

Ἐλαβε τότε τὸ ζῶον, τὸ ἐκάλυψε μὲ τὴν ποδιάν της
καὶ διηυθύνθη πρὸς τὴν κατοικίαν τοῦ χωρικοῦ, ἃν καὶ
ἔβρεχεν ἀκόμη, ὁ δὲ ἥλιος ἐπλησίαζε νὰ δύσῃ.

Ὅτε ἔφθασεν ἡ Χριστίνα, ἡ σύζυγος τοῦ χωρικοῦ ἦτο
εἰς τὴν θύραν της περικυκλωμένη ἀπὸ τὰ τέκνα της καὶ
κρατοῦσα τὸ μικρότερον εἰς τὴν ἀγκάλην της. Ὅλοι
ἐθεώρουν ὠραῖον οὐράνιον τόξον, τὸ ὁποῖον ἔλαμπε κατ’
ἐκείνην τὴν στιγμὴν διὰ τῶν ζωηροτέρων χρωμάτων.
“ Παρατηρήσατε, παιδιά μου, ἔλεγεν ἡ μήτηρ, δεικνύουσα
αὐτὸ διὰ τῆς χειρός, παρατηρήσατε τὸ ὠραῖον αὐτὸ θέαμα
καὶ εὐλογήσατε τὸν Θεόν, ὅστις τὸ ἔκαμε. Ὁ πανάγαθος
αὐτὸς Θεὸς μᾶς δεικνύει τὴν μεγαλοπρέπειαν καὶ ἰσχύν
του διὰ τῶν ἀστραπῶν καὶ τῶν κεραυνῶν, διὰ δὲ τοῦ οὐρα-
νίου τούτου τόξου μᾶς ὑπενθυμίζει τὴν ἀγάπην καὶ καλω-
σύνην του.”

Ἡ Χριστίνα, τῆς ὁποίας ἡ καρδιά ἦτον εὐθυμος, διότι
ἦτον ἄδολος, παρετήρει μετὰ μεγάλης εὐχαριστήσεως,
ἄλλοτε μὲν τὰ ὠραῖα χρώματα τοῦ οὐρανίου τόξου, τὸ
ὁποῖον ἔλαμπεν εἰς τὸν οὐρανὸν, ἄλλοτε δὲ τὰ γελαστά
πρόσωπα τῶν παιδίων τῆς χωρικῆς. Ἐσιώπα μέχρι
οὔτου τὸ οὐράνιον τόξον ἐξηφανίσθη, μετὰ δὲ ταῦτα, σύρασα
κάτωθεν τῆς ποδιᾶς της, τὸ ἀπέθεσεν ἐπὶ τῆς γῆς καὶ
διηγῆθη τίνι τρόπῳ τὸ εὔρε.

“Τοῦτο σὲ συνιστᾷ πολὺ, εἶπεν ἡ χωρική, νὰ ἔλθῃς
τόσον ἀργὰ καὶ μὲ τοιαύτην κακοκαιρίαν! Εἶσαι τίμιον
κοράσιον. — Ναί, ἀληθῶς! εἶπεν ὁ χωρικός, ὅστις ἐφάνη
κατὰ τὴν στιγμὴν ἐκείνην εἰς τὴν θύραν. Προσέξατε,

τέκνα μου, πρέπει νὰ γίνητε καὶ σεῖς μίαν ἡμέραν δίκαιοι καὶ τίμιοι ὅπως τὸ πτωχὸν αὐτὸ κοράσιον. Προτιμότερον νὰ ἔχη τις ἐν μόνον ἀρνίον καὶ νὰ ᾔηται δίκαιος καὶ τίμιος παρὰ νὰ ἔχη ἑκατόν καὶ νὰ ᾔηται δόλιος. Ἡ τιμιότης τῆς πτωχῆς Χριστίνης εἶναι θησαυρὸς τῆς καρδίας, καθιστῶν αὐτὴν πλουσιωτέραν παρ' ἂν εἶχεν ὀλόκληρον ποίμνιον, εἶναι θησαυρὸς τὸν ὅποῖον οὐδεὶς δύναται ν' ἀφαιρέσῃ ἀπ' αὐτῆς."

Ὁ υἱὸς τοῦ χωρικοῦ, ὅστις ὠνομάζετο Δημήτριος, ἔτρεξε τότε εἰς τὴν μάνδραν καὶ ἐξήγαγε μίαν προβατίναν. Ἀμέσως δὲ τὸ ἀρνίον ἐπήδησεν εἰς τὴν μητέρα του καὶ ἤρχισε νὰ σκιρτᾷ ἐκ τῆς χαρᾶς του, ὅτι τὴν ἔβλεπε. Ἡ Χριστίνα παρετήρησε μετὰ προσοχῆς καὶ εὐχαριστήσεως τὸ συγκινητικὸν τοῦτο θέαμα, καὶ εἶπε· "Μόνον αὐτὴ ἡ εὐχαρίστησις μὲ κάμνει νὰ λησμονήσω ὅλην τὴν λύπην τὴν ὁποίαν ἤσθάνθην χωριζομένη ἀπὸ τὸ ταλαίπωρον τοῦτο ζῶον, τὸ ὁποῖον εἶχον ἀγαπήσει τόσον πολὺ." — "Δοιπὸν, εἶπεν ὁ χωρικός, ἀφοῦ εἶσαι τιμία καὶ ἀγαπᾷς αὐτὸ τὸ ἀρνάκιον, θὰ σοὶ τὸ δωρήσω. Ἀλλ' εἶναι ἀκόμη πολὺ μικρόν, ὥστε δὲν θὰ ἡμπορέσῃ νὰ ζήσῃ χωρὶς γάλα, καὶ θὰ ἀποθάνῃ βασανισμένον. Μετὰ δεκαπέντε ἡμέρας θὰ ᾔηται ἀρκετὰ δυνατὸν ὅπως τρέφῃται μὲ χλόην· τότε θὰ σοὶ τὸ φέρῃ ὁ Δημήτριος . . ."

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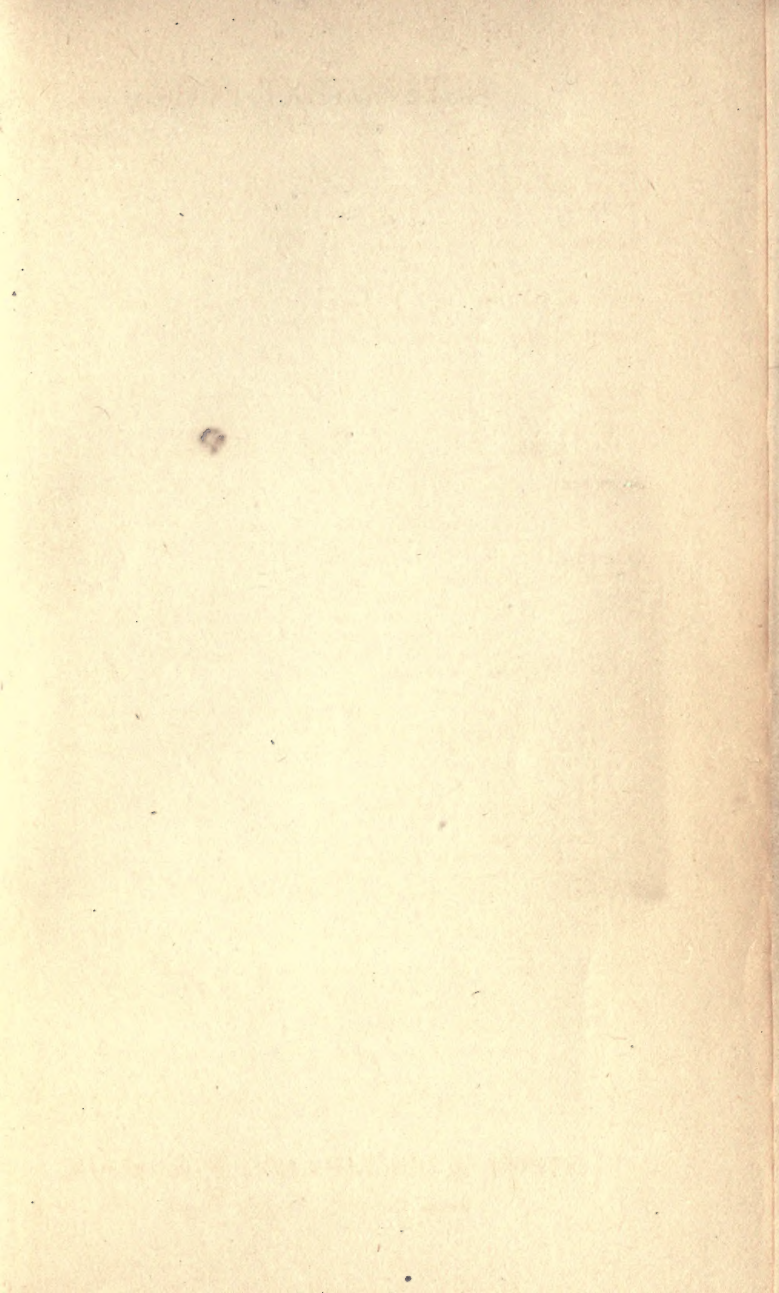
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
